NOTICE OF REVIEW HEARING

On Wednesday, November 24, 1982, at the hour of 9:00 a.m., at the Courthouse Annex, 906 Main Street, Oregon City, Oregon, the Board of County Commissioners will consider a review of the Clackamas County Hearings Officer's approval in part and denial in part of an alteration of non-conforming use, variance request to continue use of 3 buildings constructed on the property without building and zoning permits; establish the use of a chip bin; and increase the amount of outdoor storage area. Building 1 is two stories, 16'x28' and used as lunchroom, washroom and offices. Building 3 is 24'x48' and is used to house a hearth grinder. To continue the use of an approximately 6'x12' chip bin constructed on the property without necessary zoning and building permits. To continue to use approximately 1.63 acres for outdoor storage; this outdoor storage area was increased from approximately .51 acres without necessary zoning permits. A variance to reduce the sideyard setback for building 1 from 10' to 3 1/2' is also being requested.

Unless otherwise provided by the Board of County Commissioners under Section 1204.05 of the Clackamas County Zoning Ordinance, the review of the decision shall be confined to the record of the proceedings before the Hearings Officer. The Board of County Commissioners may admit additional testimony and other evidence without holding a new hearing or hear the entire matter again, if it is satisfied that the testimony or other evidence could not have been presented at the initial hearing.

The party requesting review is Roy J. Michael & Edward J. Sullivan, the applicant is the same, file number 241-81-EN, U/R.

The review is for property generally described as follows:

North side of Hwy. 211, approximately 1/2 mile west of S.E. 362nd Drive, Sandy area.
