It turns out the Oregon City Steelheads weren't invincible. They lost the Northwest Football Alliance championship game to Washington County, 26-14.

"They came out really pumped," said Allen Fry, a Sandy Union High School graduate and at times a starter at guard. "I guess we weren't pumped up enough."

He added, "We lost the wrong one. But there's nothing wrong with a 12-1 record."

He said he learned a lot, and made a lot of good friends. Though the com-

mitment cost him time, and money for gas to drive to the games and practices, he said it was "well worth it."

Next year, if the conditions are right, he said he'll

play again. He said about 2,700 attended the game at Civic Stadium Saturday, with most of them being from Washington County.

"They were out to get us," Fry said. They were the underdogs with nothing to lose.

The game was "clean," he said. There were only two turnovers, one by each

team, and four or five penalties.

The Steelheads had a 14-13 lead at one time during the second half, but the Grizzlies got the last laugh with two more touchdowns.

Cal McKinnis Sr., a veteran of 20 years of semipro football, and his son, Cal Jr., both SUHS graduates, also played. Fry said Cal Sr., a noseguard, played well.

This has been the first winning football team Fry has ever played on. The Pioneers were 4-5 one year, the closest he'd come previously to being on a winning team.

Fry works as a "gopher" for Ness and Company, a trucking firm that hauls meats and cheeses. Fry said he'll use the spare time to "rest, get rid of the bumps and bruises." That probably won't last long. He's looking forward to a warehousemen versus salesmen basketball game.

Students at Sandy Elementary will not have school that day due to parent-teacher conferences.

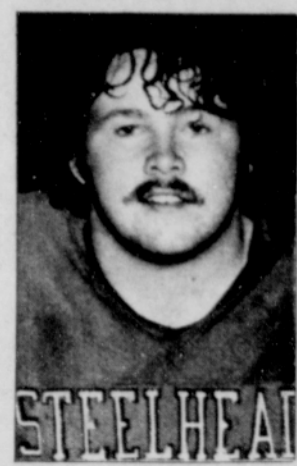
In addition, special recreational swims will be
