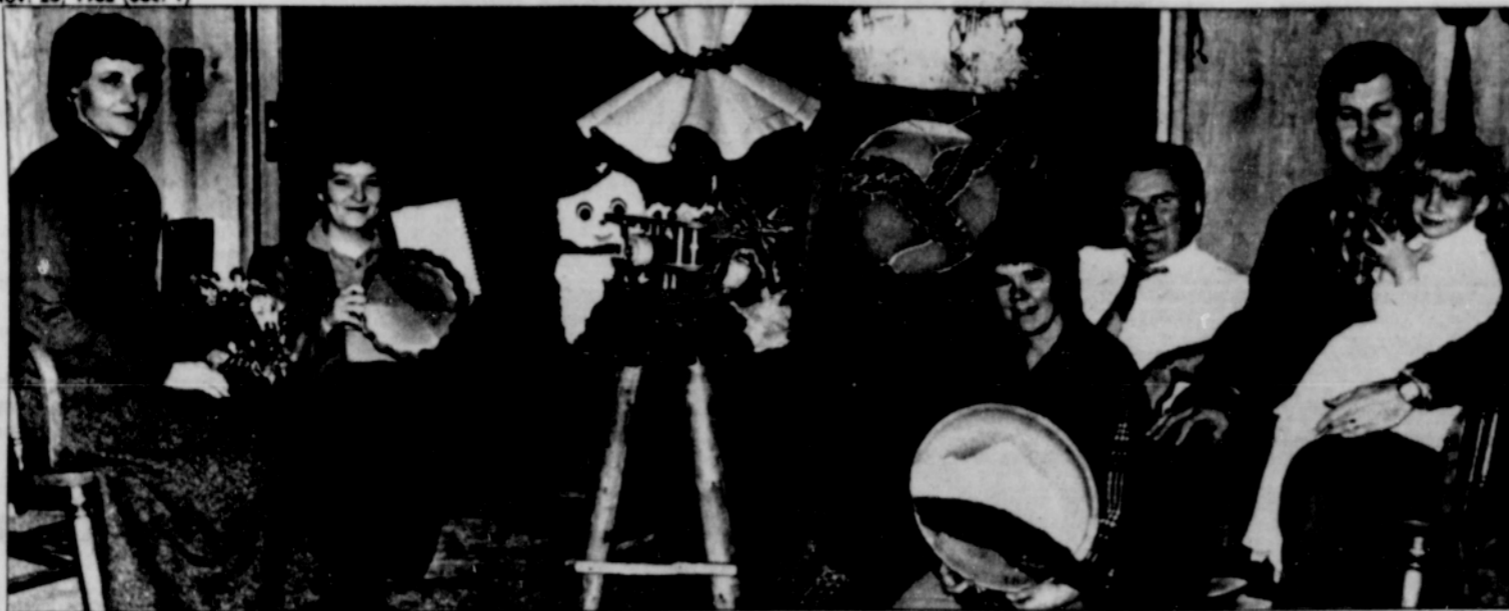
Craft chairpersons are Florence Simmons, 622-4585, and Kathy Bock, 622-4445.

Former Sandy man speaks to Reagan

Sam Brown, a 1969 Sandy Union High School graduate now living in Sumas, Wash., was one of 11 people who spoke to President Ronald Reagan via a live satellite hookup involving 11 locations.

The Puget Sound Power and Light lineman, who attended SUHS his junior and senior years, is president of the Whatcom County Young Republicans, and is a member of the Whatcom County Republican Party executive board.

Brown said he got involved in politics before the 1980 elections.

Reagan was using the satellite hookups as a fund

raiser for congressional candidates, and Brown made the call in front of about 30 people at the Holiday Inn at Bellingham.

"I was nervous," Brown admitted.

Reagan is reported to have joked, "The way I'm

being beamed all over the place, people might confuse me with Jerry Brown, California's Governor Medfly."

Brown wanted to ask Reagan a question that would not require a long,

philosophical answer, but one that was timely.

He asked about the plan to shift some federal programs to the state and local levels.

Reagan said the program, to be presented in January, would shift

responsibility for programs and how money is to be spent to the local levels.
