**George Allgeier**

Funeral services for longtime Sandy resident George Allgeier were held Saturday, Nov. 27, in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Vault interment followed at Firhill Memorial Cemetery in Sandy.

Mr. Allgeier died Nov. 27 in Sandy. He was 99 years old.

Born George Daniel Allgeier in Carrollton, Mo., Feb. 19, 1883, he was raised in Missouri and at 18 years old began to work his way west.

Upon arriving in Oregon he worked as a bridge builder for the railroad. He married Laura I. Dugger in 1913.

The family moved to the Sandy area in 1920 and cleared land to raise cattle and berries. He later worked as a millwright, along with farming and driving the school bus. At the age of 90 he continued driving tractor on the farm.

His wife preceded him in death in 1976.

Survivors include his children, Ella Lang of Cottage Grove, Irene Armstrong, Edward Allgeier and Moritz Allgeier, all of Sandy, and Arthur Allgeier of Gresham; nine grandchildren, and 12 great-grandchildren.

The family suggests memorials be made in his name to St. Jude's Home in Sandy.

**Martha Krebs**

Martha A. Krebs of Wemme died Nov. 26 in Sandy. She was 81 years old.

Born Martha A. Fenske in Seaside on Oct. 13, 1901, she married George Krebs in 1920 in Sandy. They made their home in this area. After her husband's death in 1926, she remained in the area and later married Rudolph Krebs.

They lived in the Sandy area until 1951 when they moved to Wemme. Mr. Krebs preceded her in death in 1974.

She is survived by two daughters, Esther Lymp and Evelyn Trumbly, both of Wemme; a sister, Ruth Schiewe of Redmond; two grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Monday in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Interment was at Firhill Memorial Cemetery in Sandy.

**Two days a week**

**Assessor closes office**

The Clackamas County Assessor's Office will be closed to the public two days a week.

George Malin, Clackamas County assessor and tax collector, announced at a meeting with the Board of County Commissioners last week that it will be necessary to close, to the public, the office for two days each week if the functions of the department that are required by law are to be performed.

He explained that the workload is as great as formerly, but with the

reduction of 23 staff persons at the beginning of the 1982-83 budget year, the timely processing of tax payments is not possible for the office to still provide the normal services to the public.

"Many alternatives were examined, and the decision to lock the door and not answer phones on Tuesday and Thursday was reluctantly approved," Malin said.

Currently, the restricted budgets have resulted in similar decisions in the Clackamas County Clerk's office which closes to the

public for a portion of each day.

There are several other counties including Coos, Linn and Lane which are suffering similar constraints.

I wish to express my reluctance to cause any inconvenience to any citizen who needs information from the department, Malin said. He hopes the public will understand the necessity for the closure.
