

Trial competition underway

Students in Len Eaton's street law classes are competing in the fourth annual High School Mock Trial Competition.

The competition began Tuesday and will end Dec. 9. It is being sponsored by the Oregon Law-Related Education Project, Lewis Clark College's Northwest School of Law and the Oregon State Bar. The largest number of schools to date will be competing, according to Marilyn Cover, an instructor at Lewis Clark Law School and director of the street law program.

Sandy joins seven other new schools participating in the 16-team competition. At issue in this year's hypothetical case is whether a male nurse was fired by his female supervisor as a result of sex discrimination or due to his negligence on the job.

Students will call their own witnesses, act as legal counsel, and argue their cases before more than 40 judges and attorneys who

have volunteered to participate as Mock Trial judges. A local attorney, Merrill Schneider, is working with Sandy High students on the project, according to Eaton.

This is the third year of the combination street law and business class at SUHS. Eaton said the class

helps students develop an appreciation for law and order, understand their and other's rights, and know the process of the civil and criminal justice system.

The Mock Trial Competition is being held at the Multnomah County Courthouse.

ticipating as attorneys include Kellie Garlock, Chris Norton, Alex Brewster, Peggy Gillies and Margaret Blackburn.

Students participating as witnesses include Tom Loving, Sandra Peterson, Kelly Russell, Britt Sawyer, Gregg Lewis, Darlene Lamb and Audie Ellis.

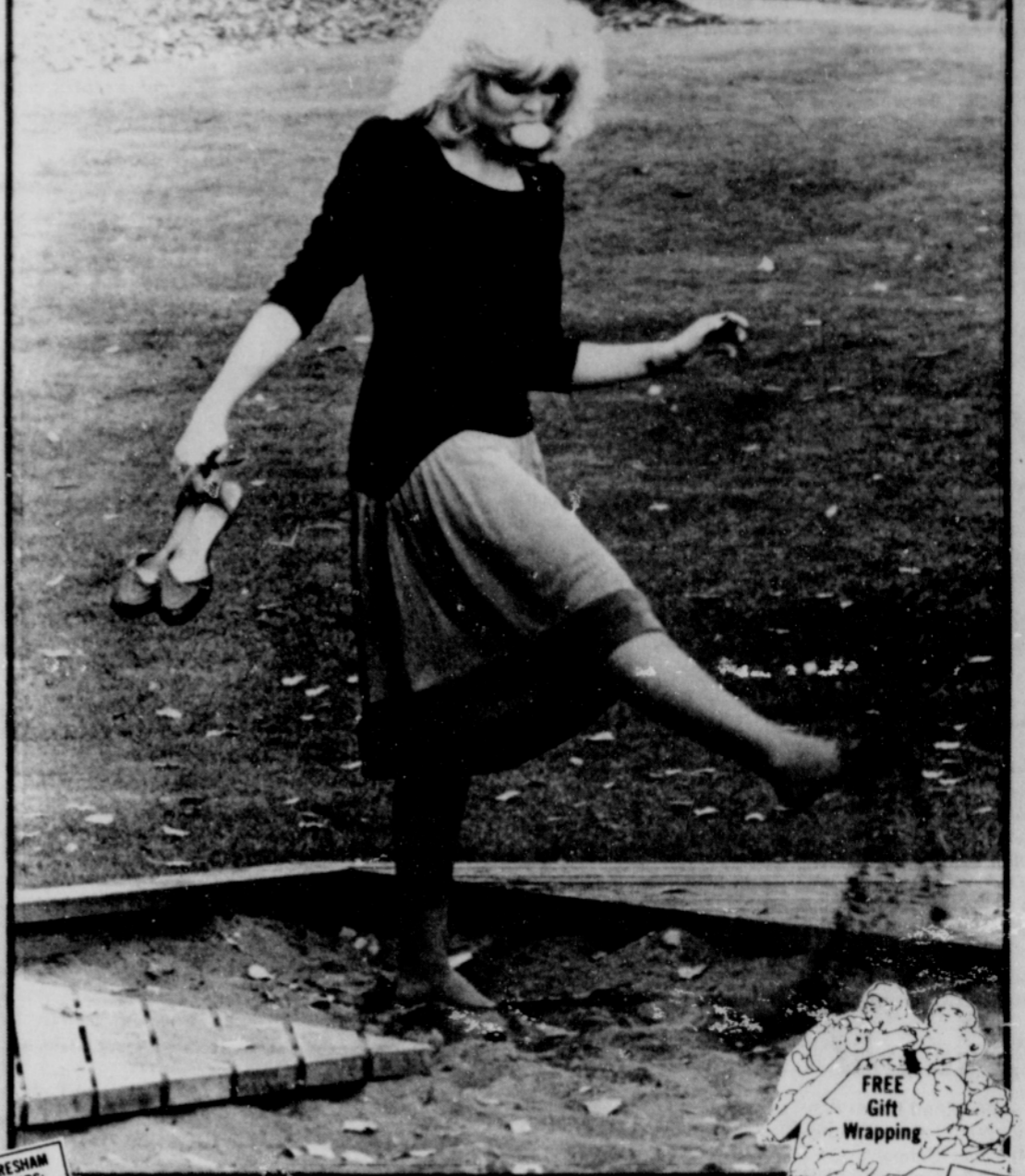

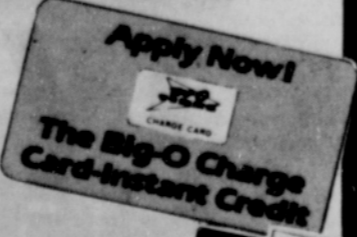

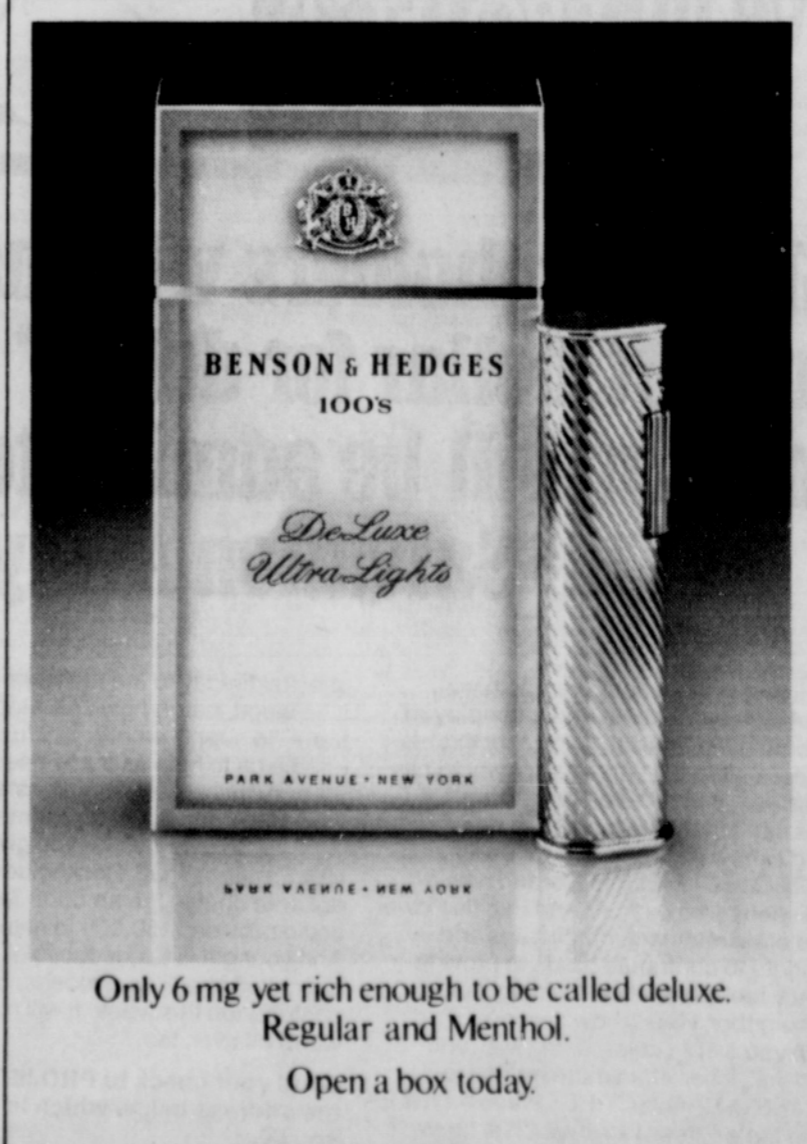
