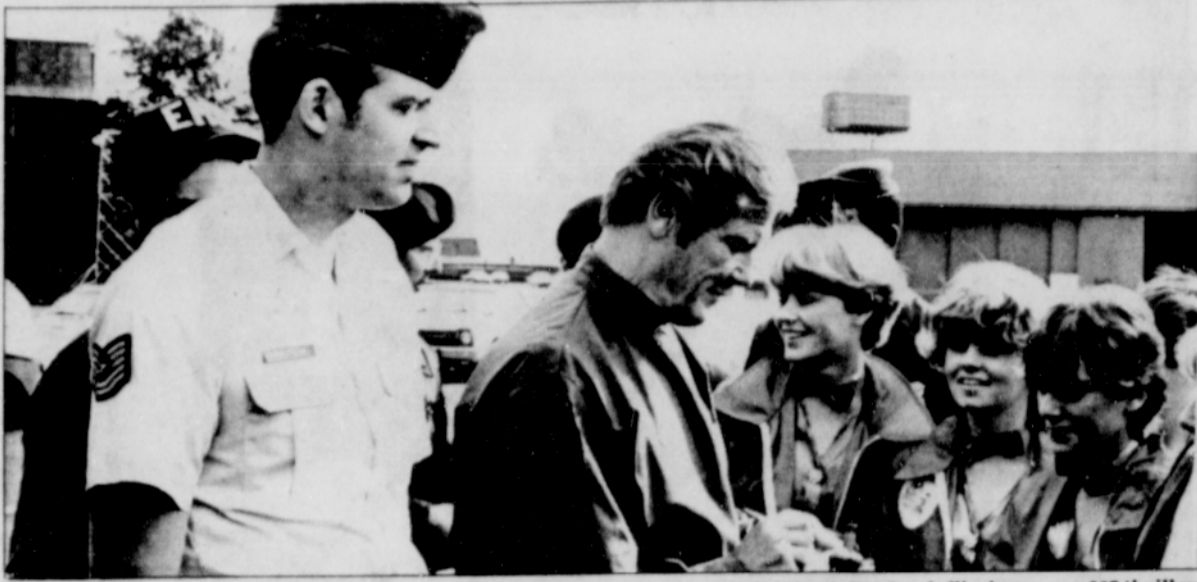

SUHS 'lawyers' compete well

Two Sandy Union High School students did "very well" in their first year of the Mock Trial Competition in Portland, according to Len Eaton, business and street law instructor.

Seniors Alex Brewster and Margaret Blackburn won two rounds before losing by four points, out of a possible 150, to Jesuit, the eventual champion.

Kellie Garlock, Chris Norton and Peggy Gillies also served as attorneys when other conflicts didn't keep them from participating.

It was Blackburn and Brewster, however, who were primarily responsible for the success of the Sandy team, Eaton said.

Merrill Schneider, a local attorney, "really helped them a lot," Eaton said, but when it came time for the competition Brewster and Blackburn were on their own.

Both are "outgoing" and "think well on their feet," Eaton said.

"I wouldn't mind them defending me in a case," he joked.

The hypothetical case concerned the dismissal of a male nurse, and whether he was fired by his female supervisor on the grounds of sex discrimination or negligence on the job.

Winning the case didn't mean the team necessarily won the round. Sandy's "attorneys" argued both sides of the case, with the competition held in courtrooms at the Multnomah

County Courthouse. More than 500 students from 16 high schools competed. Jesuit won the competition by five points. Sandy would have been third or fourth, but there was no

trial to determine which of the losers of the semifinal round was better.

Eaton called the Mock Trial Competition a "super experience."
