Boys fall by 1 to Columbia

The Pioneer boys basketball team fell 43-42 to Columbia Tuesday night, losing in the final minute.

With six seconds on the clock Columbia's Jeff McAnally connected on both ends of a one-and-one, giving the Chargers the 43-42 lead.

Sandy got the ball down court, but a 30-foot jumper by Mike Lund fell short.

The Pioneers had a four-

point lead with 30 seconds to play, but fouled three times in the final half minute, "and you don't foul with the lead," Coach Dan Brisbin pointed out.

The Chargers escaped without marring their 5-0 record. The Pioneers are 1-4.

Brisbin said the Pioneers were "very non-aggressive with the ball" the first half. The game plan was to go in-

side, take advantage of their height.

About the second half, Brisbin said, "I thought we played a good half, until the last 30 seconds."

Robert Brader, 6-6 junior, had 13 rebounds, with the Pioneers winning the battle of the boards, 26-18.

Sandy hit 16 of 39 shots from the field, and 10 of 14 from the line. Columbia hit 20 of 56, and three of 10.

Brisbin said Brader rebounded and scored well (he scored 15). Gordon Brinser "came in off the bench and gave us a big lift."

Friday night the Pioneers fell 66-44 to David Douglas.

Brisbin said, "David Douglas has a very talented ball club. I was really impressed with them. They pretty much dictated how the game went."

Steve Pettingill, 6-3 junior, scored 18 points, a season high, and was "our only consistent threat." He missed four or five minutes early in the game due to an injury.

Brisbin said, "(6-3 senior Pat) Baird got us going a little bit in the third quarter, gave us a lift, but we were pretty well down by then."

Brader was in foul trouble nearly all evening, and played only about a quarter of the game altogether.

Brisbin said they forced the Scots into some shots they didn't want to take, but couldn't keep up with them rebounding.

"They really manhandled us on the boards," he said.
