

# SCP invites audiences to cabaret

The Sandy Community Players will kick off their 1983 season with a reprise by some popular musical friends.

In their first performance away from the Sandy Community Theater, the local theater group will open the new season, Jan. 13-15, with a dinner cabaret presentation, "George Gershwin, Cole Porter and Friends," at the Collins Retreat Center south of Sandy.

The Players, battling rising costs, moved out of the local theater building this month, searching for a new home.

Steve Christensen emphasized the Retreat Center will not be the Players' permanent home, but rather presents the opportunity to present a different type of program for Sandy audiences.

"We're doing our first show down there because it's artsy and it's going to be a lot of fun for three days," said Steve Christensen who, along with Tom Ten Eyck, is busy reading music from the 1920s, '30s and '40s for the show.



Marilyn Rowell will be among the performers in the dinner cabaret presented by Sandy Community Players Jan. 13-15 at Collins Retreat Center. The cabaret will spotlight the sounds of New York during the '20s, '30s and '40s.

"We didn't want to do a show that would make people think of 'I Got Rhythm' or 'Cole Porter,'" Christensen said, so the group will reprise some of the songs from those two successful revues of the past two summers and add music from some other

musicians who helped write the top music in New York during the spotlighted era.

The sounds of Rodgers and Hart ("Bewitched, Bothered and Bewildered"), Jerome Kern ("Old Man River")

and Duke Ellington ("Take the 'A' Train") will be performed by much of the cast that entertained more than 2,000 persons during "I Got Rhythm's" run last summer.

The dinner theater will be a benefit for SCP as they

begin a new season. Tickets for dinner and entertainment will be \$10, and \$8 for senior citizens and children under 12. Reservations are necessary and must be made by Jan. 12. They are available at Sandy Country Florist.

## Window-breaker charged

A Sandy man was arrested early Monday morning after the window of a local business was broken out.

Randy Scott Duggan, 19, was arrested by Sandy police and charged with criminal mischief at 2:21 a.m. after the front window at Camera Connection was broken out. The window was valued at \$400.

Duggan was taken to Clackamas County Jail. Martin Ledesma Reyes, 20, of Sandy was also arrested Monday following a shoplifting incident at Williams Thriftway. He was cited for taking a comb, valued at \$1.79, and released.

A Zigzag youth was injured Dec. 20 when the car he was a passenger in collided with another vehicle at a Sandy intersection.

Paul Roberts, 17, was taken to Gresham Community Hospital after the 1969 Volkswagen he was riding in collided with a 1971 Toyota Corolla, driven by Myrtle Lemen of Sandy,

at the intersection of Proctor Boulevard and Meinig Avenue at 8:35 p.m.

According to local police reports, the Lemen vehicle was southbound on Meinig when it collided with the Volkswagen, driven by Joseph Robert Smith, 18, of Boring. The Smith vehicle was traveling north, making a left-hand turn onto Proctor when the accident occurred.

No citations were issued. A South Bluff Road resident told police that someone entered his home and took infant clothes valued at \$112. The burglary occurred between Dec. 19 and 20.

A North Bluff resident told police that someone broke the window of his pickup truck while it was parked outside his

residence early Christmas morning and took a car stereo and cameras valued at \$600. A jacket was taken from another vehicle in the same incident.
