## Chamber bills man with pipeline plan

A Gresham man has a plan that he says would solve Portland's solid waste problem, stop the need for landfills and create needed jobs.

Bob Lawson's plan is to take the solid waste from Portland and the Willamette Valley and pipe it over the Cascades into Central Oregon where by-products would be produced.

The plan—the dream of “a whole bunch of little people”—is in the citizen-awareness stage now. This Tuesday, Jan. 4, Lawson will discuss his plan at the

luncheon meeting of the Sandy Area Chamber of Commerce at noon at the Tollgate Inn.

Solid Waste Group has a plan. The group has developed the technology to create a by-product from solid waste that is far less expensive than cement, wood, plastics or metals.

The pay-off of the whole system, he says, is a tremendous tax savings.

“Our whole intention is to take it off our tax back,” Lawson said. “We don't want it a state-funded project. We want it on a private enterprise basis.”
