## Receipts are down by nearly 50 percent

Thirty-one counties in Oregon and 27 counties in Washington received \$65 million from the sale and use of national forest products and services in fiscal year 1982.

The state of Oregon received \$46,851.99 and the state of Washington received \$18,108,430.15.

Last year Oregon received \$95,112,708.07 and Washington received \$29,396,778.66.

The money, returned to the states and in turn to the counties, represents 25 percent of the money collected from the sale of timber, and from grazing, recreation, minerals and other land-use charges. The money is to be used for public schools and roads.

Clackamas County received \$2,263,865.43 for 1982. The year before the county received \$5,589,030.87.

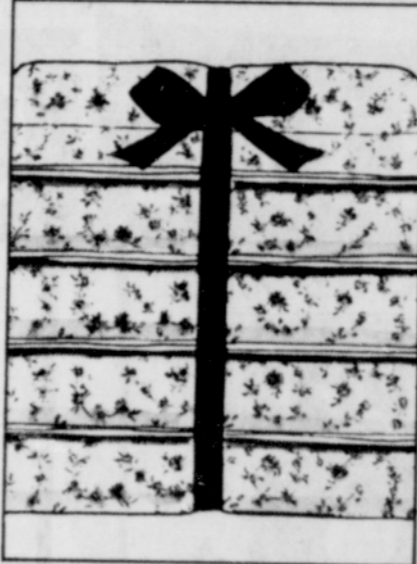

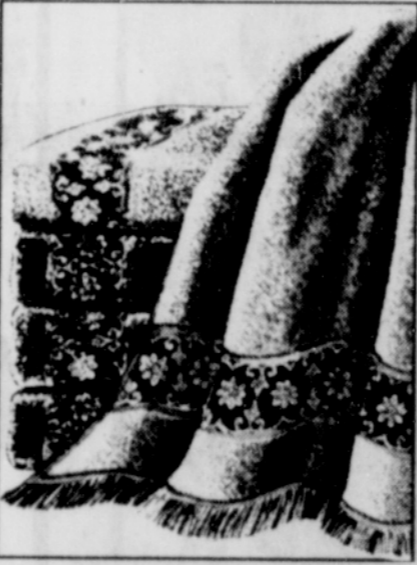

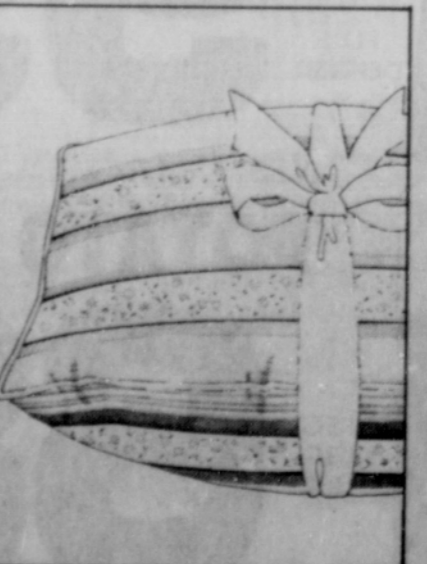
