Residents asked to back smaller levy

Clackamas County residents will be asked for \$1.35 million in March to run the county's library system for the next three years.

The levy amount was determined by officials from the Council of Librarians and the Citizens

Policy Board. Set to go before voters March 29, the levy is \$240,000 less than the levy approved by voters in 1980.

Sandy librarian Sue Newlands served on the committee that set the levy and said the drop was the result of a "very, very con-

servative" nature by the group.

She noted that the increase in automation was a leading factor in the group's ability to reduce some spending.

Dick Tuffli, county libraries director, cited more efficient manage-

ment and the savings of the Clackamas County-wide Cooperative Library Network's computerized circulation system.

The network is a consortium of 38 public, school and special libraries in the county. Sandy Public Library is included in the

funding network and the assistance is invaluable.

"If the levy were not to pass, our funding would be cut by 80 percent and we would probably have to charge out-of-city users," Newlands said.
