Timeshares go on market at Rippling River Resort

The first phase development of a vacation timeshare complex at the Rippling River Resort in Wemme has been announced by Portland developer O.M. "Pete" Wilson.

Wilson, president of Pete Wilson Realty, said the former Green Tee Inn has been converted into 459 timeshare units. The property, situated adjacent to the 18th green on the former Bowman's golf course, has been renamed the Mount Hood Village Resort.

The Rippling River site was selected for a timeshare property "because it is the closest destination resort to serve the Portland and Mount Hood area. It has always been popular as a family recreational facility," Wilson said.

Sales efforts will begin immediately, he said.

Timeshares in Mount Hood Village will be offered at prices starting at \$4,500. Financing has been arranged to offer fixed 10-year mortgages at 12 percent, Wilson said.

"Purchasers will receive a deeded interest with the

right to exchange vacation time with other resort areas through the RCI international exchange network," Wilson added.

He said his firm has negotiated a perpetual use

agreement with Rippling River management for the resort's recreational facilities including golf courses, tennis courts, swimming pool and spa, hiking trails and river access.

Eventually, Wilson added, his firm expects to develop more than 3,000 timeshares at the Rippling River complex.

The city of Sandy is attempting to sell the 62-space lot to recoup its \$97,000 debt for the project.

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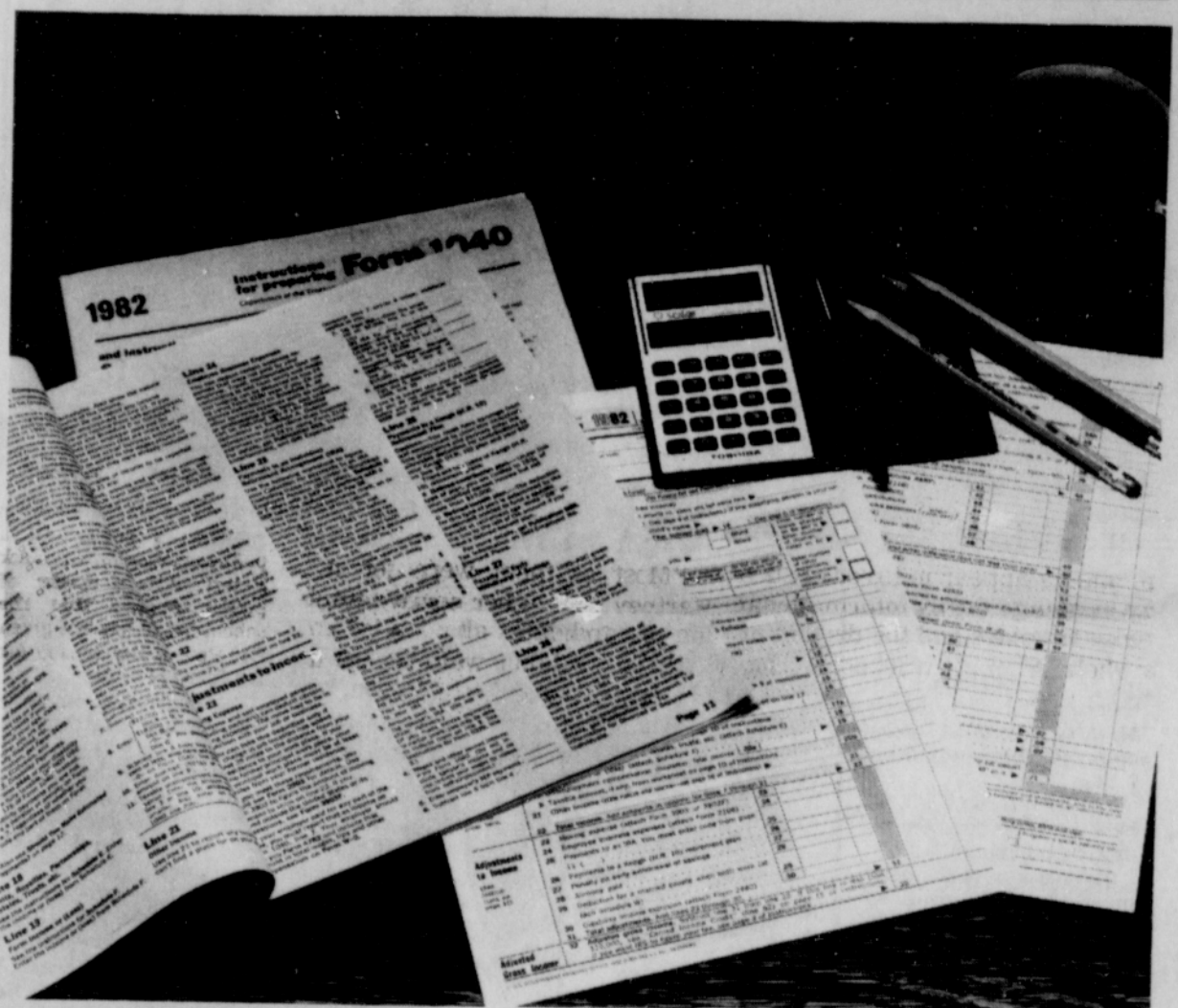

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How to turn a small addition into a big deduction.

Add to your Clackamas County Bank IRA before April 15, and deduct it from your 1982 taxes.

If you open or add to a Clackamas County Bank Individual Retirement Account between now and April 15, you can still deduct it from your 1982 taxes.

How much can you add—and deduct? The maximum total for the year is \$2000, or 100% of your taxable income, whichever is less. If you have a non-working spouse, you may contribute up to \$2250 between you. And if you both work, you can each have an IRA and deduct up to \$4000 on a joint return.

However, there is no minimum requirement, which means you can still get big deduction benefits from even a small contribution.

So stop by Clackamas County Bank today and open or add to your IRA. Your biggest deduction for 1982 could be an addition in 1983.

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
