What's Cooking:

Dutch recipe perfect

This vegetable recipe offers a delicious accompaniment to meat, especially roast beef.

Hutspot (A Dutch Recipe)
Combine in a saucepan: 5-6 potatoes, sliced; 2-3 carrots, sliced; 2 onions, chopped.

Cover with water, 1/2 teaspoon salt, and cook until tender. Drain off excess water, add one tablespoon butter or margarine, 1/4 cup milk, and pepper to taste. Mash until fluffy. Serve at once. Serves 4-6.

Mile-High Strawberry Pie Crust:

1 1/2 cups flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 tablespoons sugar
1/2 cup oil
2 tablespoons milk
Mix above in pie plate and press in bottom and on sides. Bake 10-12 minutes at 400 degrees. Cool.

Beat two egg whites until frothy. Add one cup sugar gradually while beating. Add two tablespoons lemon juice. Add one 10-ounce package frozen sliced strawberries which have been thawed until icy. Beat for 15 minutes at high speed. Do not underbeat. Fold in 1/2 pint whipping

cream which has been beaten until stiff. Put mix in shell and immediately into freezer. Keep frozen until ready to serve.
