Firemen host sportsman's feed

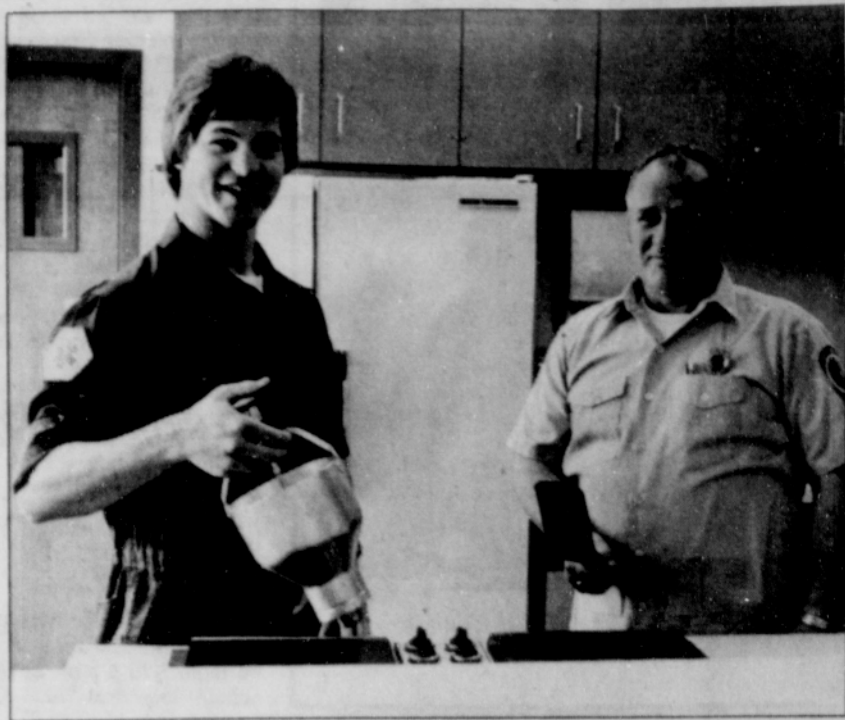

County realtors honor Sandy man

The Clackamas County Board of Realtors highlighted the organization's annual observance of Private Property Week with the introduction of Dale Nicholls of Sandy as its 1983 Realtor of the Year.

Nicholls is broker-owner of Pioneer Real Estate in Sandy and serves as a state director, representing the Clackamas County Board of the Oregon Association of Realtors. He has also served the local board as chairman of the Legislative and Real Estate Sign Placement committees, as well as a local director.

During the late 1950s, he served as president of the Palmdale, Calif., Board of Realtors, as a director of the California Association of Realtors in 1964 and as Realtor of the Year in 1965.

The business is, however, a second career for Nicholls. His first was more colorful and more glamorous. During the 1940s and 1950s he was a regular member of big bands of the jazz music era, before he even dreamed of a real estate career.

He married a fellow Nebraskan, Doris Deaver, in 1935. They have gathered around them a family of four sons and four daughters. They also have

13 grandchildren. In the 1940s, after moving west, he played trombone accompanying Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis on a tour of the country. In 1949 he joined the Desi Arnaz band, playing at the Biltmore Hotel in Los Angeles, eventually working eight years at Desilu Studios. He appeared in more than 250 episodes of "I Love Lucy."

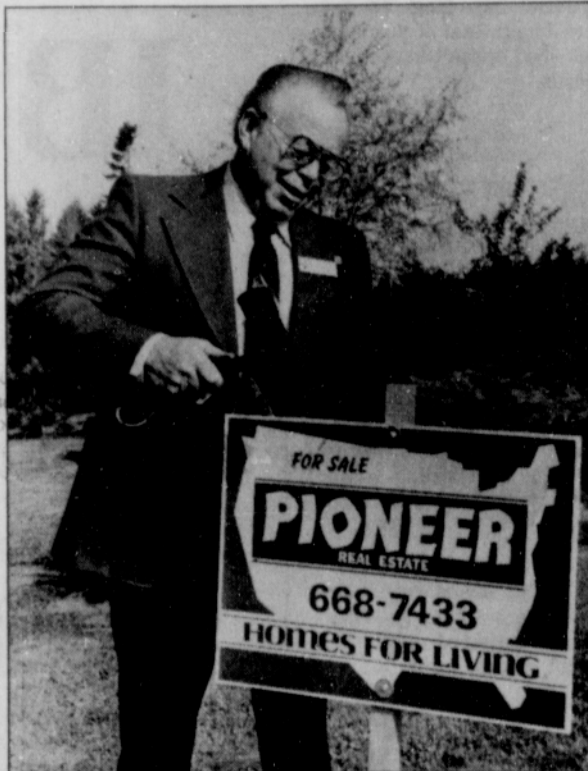
Nicholls also appeared regularly with Jimmy Durante, Dinah Shore, Ozzy and Harriet and Gene Autry on their shows.

Judy Garland once draped her legs over his shoulders while singing "Somewhere Over the Rainbow."

Today, he combines two careers as a real estate professional and an entertainer by making contributions to civic and community life. He was president of the Sandy Chamber of Commerce in 1970 and president of Sandy Kiwanis from 1972-73.

Nicholls also organizes the annual July 4 fireworks show for Sandy Civic Services and organizes music for the annual Sandy Mountain Festival.

In 1975 he was named Citizen of the Year by the Sandy Area Chamber of Commerce.

1. Yearly physical exams that include blood pressure monitoring, heart, lung, abdomen, thyroid, and skin assessment. Women's health care which includes PAP smears and breast exams.
2. Assessment and treatment of minor emergencies, lacerations, infections, chronic illness (asthma, diabetes, etc.), minor emotional crisis, and skin lesions.
3. Counseling and guidance for birth control, family planning, pregnancy tests, and crises of daily living.
4. Health education and support groups.
5. Home visits and skilled nursing care for the homebound, elderly, and dying person.
