Woodcutting lottery results due

A computer is lending U.S. Forest Service officials a hand as they decide who will get to cut wood during selected periods.

The Zigzag Ranger District will stop accepting lottery applications this Monday, April 25, for the district's first two-month woodcutting period in May and June.

Woodcutters will be selected with help from a computer at the Mt. Hood National Forest's Portland office.

"The computer sort should insure fairness and prevent any of the mechanical problems in-

herent in a mechanical drawing," said Herb Evans, public information officer for the Zigzag District.

The Forest Service expects to issue approximately 1,250 permits. So far, however, the district has received just 1,100 applications, Evans said, but they have been coming in at a rate of 50-60 a day.

Woodcutters interested in participating in the first woodcutting period must submit their applications to the district by the close of business on Monday to qualify.

To apply for the drawing,

prospective woodcutters should submit a 3 by 5 card with name, address, and telephone and a stamped, self-addressed envelope to the district. The address is Zigzag Ranger District, 70220 East Highway 26, Zigzag, OR 97049. Applications may be delivered in person.

Applications received after the deadline will be entered in the drawing for the second woodcutting period scheduled for July and August.

District personnel will begin selecting and notifying woodcutters of the outcome of the drawing on

April 26.

Woodcutters selected in the lottery will be able to purchase their permits and load receipts beginning May 1 at the Zigzag Ranger Station. The permits will allow holders to purchase a minimum of two cords and a maximum of six cords of wood at \$5 per cord. Woodcutters are advised to make the minimum purchase of wood as no refunds will be made. Woodcutters will be allowed to return to the district to purchase more wood as long as it's during the period in which they were issued a permit.

Permits and load receipts for the first wood-

cutting period will be valid until June 30.

Woodcutters are only allowed one application and although the computer will provide a random sampling, duplications will have to be culled by hand, according to Evans.

Permits for the Barlow District will also be available at the Zigzag Ranger District. Permits in the Barlow District are available on a first-come, first-serve basis and may be purchased in addition to permits held in the Zigzag District, as long as the combined total of purchased wood doesn't exceed six cords.

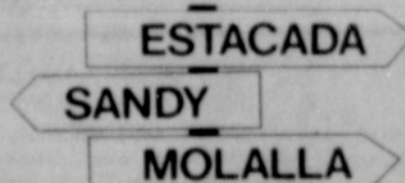
