Herbert Lundgaard

Retired berry farmer Herbert Lundgaard died April 17 in Gresham. He was 91.

He was born Sept. 2, 1891 in Dodgeville, Wis. After receiving his education in Holmen, Wis., he enlisted in the U.S. Army during World War I. After his discharge, he returned to Wisconsin where he married Gertrude Kayser on June 28, 1922. They remained in Wisconsin until 1947 when they moved to Oregon to make their home east of Sandy.

Mr. Lundgaard worked as a stone mason and in a packing plant for Oscar Mayer Meats while living in Wisconsin.

Since moving to Oregon

he raised strawberries until his retirement. His taxidermy hobby became an additional occupation until his eyesight failed him.

He also enjoyed sculpting and oil painting.

Mr. Lundgaard is survived by his wife, Gertrude; children, Leona Proctor of Prineville, Bernice "Chris" Bunker of California, Eloise Haefner, Alvina Haak and Clairice Haefner, all of Boring, and Ruth Ahlberg of Sandy; 22 grandchildren, and 27 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at the Gresham Seventh-day Adventist Church. Vault interment followed at Willamette National Cemetery in Portland.

Sandy Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Jack Blaser

Funeral services were held Saturday for longtime Sandy resident Jack Blaser at Gresham Little Chapel of the Chimes.

He died Wednesday at Fairlawn Care Center in Gresham. He was 65.

He was born Aug. 25, 1917 in Portland and later moved to Sherwood and then to Sandy around 1937. A landscaper and groundskeeper, Mr. Blaser's hobby was flower gardening.

Survivors include his sister, Bertha Raz of Portland; three brothers, Sam and Arnold, both of Tillamook, and Lee of Boring, and many nieces and nephews.

Private burial was at Greenwood Hills Cemetery in Portland.

Thursday the class dug out the area and set the forms. "And then some convict type, as he described himself, came by and helped us with the forms," Geren said. "He said, 'Oh, this hurts my heart.'"

"In 20 minutes he turned an amateur job into a professional one," Geren

added.

Friday morning they poured the cement and Jim Gordon, owner of Sandy Ready Mix, and the cement truck driver helping them work things out.

"When we started it looked terrible and when we finished up it looked great," Geren said. "The kids learned more in those two days than they would have in nine weeks of classroom work."

Sandy's FFA chapter will receive points in state competition in a Build Our American Community program, he said.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a special election to be held on Tuesday, May 17, 1983, between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the following districts the following questions:

SANDY UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT UH2 COMBINED OPERATING LEVY

QUESTION: Shall Sandy High School District UH2 levy \$2,908,775 outside tax base for financing District operations for fiscal year 1983-84?

PURPOSE: The purpose of the levy is to fund the educational programs and necessary support services for approximately 1,200 Sandy High School students for the 1983-84 school year. If this measure is approved, \$2,025,318 of the taxes levied in the 1983-84 fiscal year are eligible for partial state funding. However, \$883,457 of the taxes levied will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial state payment.

SANDY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT #46

QUESTION: Shall the Sandy Elementary District levy \$1,980,914 outside Oregon's Constitutional limitation for operating expenses during the 1983-'84 fiscal year?

PURPOSE: The establishment of this levy is for funding the educational programs for the children of the district in grades one through eight. The Cedar Ridge, Firwood, Kelso, and Sandy Elementary buildings are included in this operating proposal.

The district does not have a tax base to provide the educational program required by the State Constitution and State Statute as adopted by the District board, therefore, this operating levy is being presented for voter approval.

If this measure is approved \$1,784,582 of the taxes levied in the 1983-'84 fiscal year are eligible for partial state funding. However, \$196,332 of the taxes will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial state payment.

WELCHES ELEMENTARY NO. 13 COMBINED A & B OPERATIONS LEVY

QUESTION: Shall Welches Elementary School District levy \$189,186 in excess of the statutory limitation for an operating levy for 1983-1984?

PURPOSE: These funds are to support existing programs and to provide new funding for a .5 FTE guidance counselor and a computer literacy program.

The district's tax base does not provide sufficient funds to support the district's programs.

If the measure is approved, \$28,909 of the taxes levied in the 1983-1984 fiscal year are eligible for partial state funding. However, \$160,277 of the taxes will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial state payment. The combined levies would cost approximately \$0.85 per \$1000 evaluation before applicable tax relief. We anticipate the total tax rate for next year to be approximately \$0.26 per \$1000 less than the current year.
