Martha Erp

Funeral services for Martha Lucille Erp will be held today, April 28, at 10:30 a.m. in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Private interment will follow at Willamette National Cemetery in Portland.

She died April 28 in Gresham. She was 73.

Mrs. Erp was born Feb. 24, 1908 in Tennessee.

She moved to the West Coast in 1929 where she married Festus "Fey" Erp in Washington in 1935. They lived in Washington until the early 1940s when they moved to the Gresham area.

During World War II, Mrs. Erp worked in the Portland ship yards. Since that time, she worked as a homemaker and care giver to many.

After her husband's death in 1967, she remained at her Gresham home until 1982 when she moved to Sandy where she became involved with the Sandy Senior Center.

Mrs. Erp is survived by two brothers, Will and George Griggs, both in Kansas; a sister, Mary Atchley in Tennessee, and many cousins.

B.F. Waldron

Former Sandy resident B.F. Waldron died March 18 in Seattle, Wash., after a lengthy illness.

He owned a house on Bluff Road in Sandy in the early 1940s, and worked as manager of the Sandy Electric Co-op, which was sold to Portland General Electric in 1956. He was not the manager when the Sandy Electric Coop was sold, however.

He is survived by a son in Seattle, and his sister, Arlene Stephens of McAllen, Texas.

...Provides primary health care to adolescents and adults. Examples of care are:

1. Yearly physical exams that include blood pressure monitoring, heart, lung, abdomen, thyroid, and skin assessment. Women's health care which includes PAP smears and breast exams.
2. Assessment and treatment of minor emergencies, lacerations, infections, chronic illness (asthma, diabetes, etc.), minor emotional crisis, and skin lesions.
3. Counseling and guidance for birth control, family planning, pregnancy tests, and crises of daily living.
4. Health education and support groups.
5. Home visits and skilled nursing care for the homebound, elderly, and dying person.
6. Community services that include foot clinics, health forums, resource referral, and formal educational programs.
