

Students eye occupational opportunities

Owl finds lasting home

A two-foot owl with wings spread wide is now on permanent display at Firwood School, thanks to the effort of two Firwood students, the Firwood Parent Teacher Club, and taxidermists at Mt. Hood Community College.

The Ron Preston family's barn on Paha Loop Road was the refuge chosen by a great horned owl during a recent storm. Apparently the owl injured itself in the barn where the Prestons found it, dazed but still breathing.

Laura and Sally Preston, ages 8 and 7,

were instructed by the Oregon Fish and Game Department to place the owl in a warm spot and feed it red meat, hamburger, and water. However, the owl which the girls dubbed "Clyde" did not survive its injuries.

The great horned owl is a protected species and anyone handling the birds without a permit is subject to fines of up to \$1000 and a jail term. The Prestons realized this and took the owl to MHCC, one of few agencies holding such a permit. The college agreed to loan the owl, along with appropriate permits, to Firwood when it learned

the PTC would pay for preservation costs.

The great horned owl is the largest owl commonly found in Oregon. The owl is a predator, generally feeding on large rodents although it occasionally snares chickens or other small domestic animals. Because of its predatory nature, the owl was one of the last birds placed on the protected list.

The familiar "hoot" is a call characteristic to the Great Horned owl. Contrary to popular belief most other owls whistle or hiss.

The owl will be used for instructional purposes at the school.

Sign-up set for new first graders

Pre-registration for children entering first grade this fall at Sandy Elementary School will be held in the school library next Thursday, May 5, at 1 p.m. Prospective students and their parents are asked to attend.

According to Ellie Metts of the school, a child must

be at least 6 years old by Nov. 15, 1983 to qualify for first grade this September. Parents should bring a birth certificate or hospital record of their child's birth and complete immunization records.

"The children will go with first-grade teachers for an introduction to the first grade classrooms,"

Metts said.

While in the classroom, the children will participate in exercises to determine their readiness level. However, this informal testing is for information only and will not determine whether a child actually starts first grade, Metts emphasized.

While the children are in the classrooms, parents will complete the necessary registration forms. In addition, parents will receive information regarding the policies and procedures of the school such as the closed campus rules and scheduling of school days.

Firwood PTC hosts fingerprinting

Child snatching is a growing concern among parents nationwide. Children disappear and, in some cases, are never heard from again.

One method to help identify children that is gaining popularity across the nation is child fingerprinting.

Firwood School's Parent Teacher Club is bringing that service to the Sandy area for parents of children in that school's service area.

The PTC will sponsor a fingerprinting clinic at the school next Wednesday, May 4. The Clackamas County Four-Wheelers will conduct the fingerprinting activities in Building B's central area.

The club has been trained by the Clackamas County Sheriff's Department to

conduct the test.

Parents must accompany children to sign a release form and will be given a full set of their children's fingerprints.

Fingerprints have been identified as the surest way to identify missing children.

There will be absolutely no record kept of the fingerprints taken at Firwood School by anyone. They are for the personal and exclusive use of the parent or guardian.

A donation of 50 cents per child will be requested to help defray the cost of supplies and expenses.

Along with the fingerprints, parents should keep eye and hair color, infant footprints, blood type and a

recent photo in their children's identification file. Dental and medical records are also valuable.

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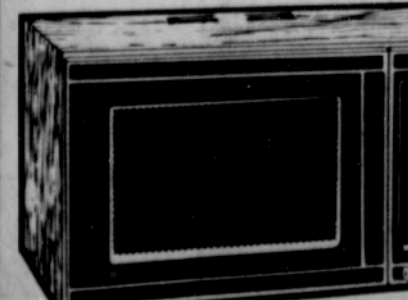
