Freshman legislator Shiprack himself has drafted a bill that looks likely to pass, he said.

Welches School building problems that cost the district a quarter-million dollars prompted electrical contractor Shiprack to draw a bill to allow state government bodies to not accept low bids that don't appear sound. The reasoning is that low bidders may not be the best contractors to do the job.

Shiprack said he doesn't give a state sales tax much chance.

"They're talking 4 percent and that includes services, but exempts food, clothing, drugs and utilities."
