

Daugherty gets lone 1st

Although some good efforts were turned in, the finishes at the loaded Centennial Invitational were lacking.

Paige Daugherty had Sandy's lone first place with a 41-5½ put in the shot.

Scott Skipper was third in the javelin with a 206 throw, and was fourth in the discus with a toss of 150-3.

The boys short relay team took seventh with a 44.8, a time that pleased Coach Randy Hutchinson. "That's got to be a milestone for us," he said.

Ryan Coombs, Bryan Prosser, Darren Ford and Mark Beck comprised that team.

Steve Pettingill was again denied the junior class discus record, but only by about a foot. He threw a 146-6 for sixth.

Sharon Jensen finished sixth in the long jump with a leap of 16-2.

Coombs didn't place in the long jump, but Hutchinson was pleased with his 20-2 jump.

Brian Reick dropped his personal record by 19 seconds, running a 9:11 3000 against an "unbelievable field."

Tracy Garrison of Klamath Falls ran a 8:17.1 3000, the second fastest in the nation this year. Steve Prefontaine's 1969 national and Oregon record is 8:08.0.

Patty Groombridge set a personal record in the 800 Saturday, running a 2:25.4.

Coral Howell and Sandy Roberts ran 63.5 and 62.7 splits as the mile relay team turned in a 4:14, its best of the season.

Tyson Cummins and Sam Romey ran 51.9 and 51.1 splits as the boys mile relay team finished with a 3:30.5. Romey and Cummins ran "extremely well," Hutchinson said.

In the high jump Lisa Lind went five feet, finishing seventh.

Heptathlon

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In the high jump she went 4-6 and 1/4. She felt she should have gone at least five feet, with the difference costing her over 200 points.

Roth said, "When I didn't score a lot of points there, I thought, 'I'm doomed now.'"

Her 27-7 throw in the shot was below the 30 feet she's thrown consistently in practice.

The second day her steps were off in the long jump. "Usually my steps are okay but my jumps are off," she said, perhaps half joking.

"I'm not having that great of a season."

At the time of the heptathlon Roth had competed in meets on four of eight days, usually in four events each outing. Her workhorse days hardly ended upon graduation from SUHS.

In the past, Roth said, she's trained for the 800 and has just taken what's come in the heptathlon. This time she trained for the heptathlon, but the marks just didn't come.

Jensen "really pulled through" considering her injury, Roth said. "I give her a lot of credit for that. I think she's going to do a lot better at nationals, after she's had a month to recover."

As for Roth, she said she's physically and mentally drained. Her work load is much heavier than it was in high school, and when three sports are added to that, it's perhaps "too much."

Right now she faces a dilemma over which event to compete in in the upcoming District 2 track and field championships.

The two most promising events for her, the 800 and

the 400 hurdles, are run back to back, and so she's going to have to choose.

In the 400 hurdles she's run a 1:06, and the national qualifying time is 1:04. In the 800 she still needs to drop six or more seconds off her time, for a 2:15. But she's an experienced 800 runner, and thinks that may be her best opportunity.

She'll either have to hit a national qualifying time twice in the next two weekends or win a district championship to qualify for nationals. "I'm going to have to work to get it, but they're within my reach," Roth said.

Roth has already qualified for two national meets the past school year. She was 62nd at the NAIA national cross country championships. This winter she won district-regional championships in the 50- and 100-yard free, and was on three relay teams that also won championships.

In all, she competed in seven events at the NAIA national swim meet. Her track coach, Charles Bowles, teases her about being an All-American in "only" six of those events. One must finish in the top six at the national meet to qualify for All-American status.

Roth was second in the 50 free at nationals, and sixth in the 100. He butterfly leg of the 200 medley relay, however, was the "most fun."

She was the third person out of the blocks, and a lot was on her shoulders as the last person, who would be swimming a 50 free, was a 1500 swimmer and injured to boot.

Roth turned in a good

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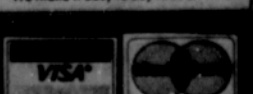
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
