

SUHS assembly honors top '83 graduates

Three Sandy Union High School honor students will be recognized tomorrow afternoon at a special awards assembly at the school.

The outstanding senior of the 210-member class will also be named at the assembly at 1 p.m. in the gymnasium. Following the Awards Assembly, the school will host a tea in the career center for award winners, their parents and the senior class.

Honored as co-valedictorians will be Alex Brewster and Anne Sarich. Both maintained a 4.0 grade point average at the school.

Christy Finnemann will be cited as salutatorian. She maintained a 3.98 grade point average.

The honorees will join their classmates at baccalaureate services this Tuesday, May 24, at 7:30 p.m. in the high school gymnasium.

Commencement will be Wednesday, May 25, at 6:30 p.m. at Rannow Stadium, weather permitting. Inclement weather would force the exercises into the gymnasium and require tickets.

The class of 1983 chose light blue and Newport blue as class colors and white baby rose as class flower.

The class chose "If you can imagine it you can achieve it, if you can dream it you can become it" as their motto.

dent Body president and organized a student march supporting passage of the school budget last fall. During his school years, he was a delegate to the State Leadership Convention and to the YMCA Legislative Convention.

A Rotary Intern Delegate to Argentina in 1982, he studied there for one year and gave slide and orientation talks to Rotary and community groups about the United States. Brewster also lived six weeks with a Japanese family and was a 4-H delegate to a Canadian farm where he represented the Sandy Prime C 4-H Club.

Brewster was also an exchange student for one month in Mexico

and was Rotary Youth Ambassador discussing his exchange student experiences in Argentina with local community groups.

He served as honorary page for the U.S. Senate, honorary legislative assistant in the House of Representatives. Brewster was also a member of National Honor Society, Future Farmers of America, Future Business Leaders of America and the speech club.

Brewster plans to fulfill his undergraduate studies at the Edmund A. Walsh School at Georgetown University, studying foreign cultures with emphasis on Latin America. He plans to

study abroad at least one year and intends on receiving his master's degree in business administration.

His career choice lies in international business and diplomacy.

Sarich was also a member of the National Honor Society and participated in American Field Service, Foreign Language Club and speech club. She was active in organizing the girl's high school soccer team two years ago and is an active member of Cascade Ski Club in Government Camp.

She lettered in varsity soccer and softball and was this year's captain of both teams.

A member of the Sandy High School ski team for three years during which it won the state title each year, Sarich was the 1981-82 state giant slalom champion. This season she won the slalom and giant slalom state titles. She is an active member of Northwest Ski Association and travels the Northwest Ski Cup circuit in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

She plans to attend a four-year college and obtain a bachelor's degree in education, continuing with a master's degree in business.

Finnemann was an active member of the high school band, playing flute, as well as a member of pep band and wind ensemble.

Also a National Honor Society member, she participated in Clackamas County skills competition in typing, math, accounting and economics. She also taught evening GED classes for Mt. Hood Community College.

Finnemann was scholar of the month for January in mathematics at Sandy High School and was named teenager of the month for the Gresham Elks Lodge in March.

She plans to attend MHCC for two years in general studies and then transfer to a state college to major in computer science.
