C. Willcoxon

Memorial services were held at the Sandy Kingdom Hall last Friday for Charles A. Willcoxon, longtime Sandy resident who died May 25 after an extended illness. He was 82.

He was born Sept. 6, 1900 in Mount Moriah, Mo. On his own from age 10, he spent most of his early adult life working as a farm hand and finishing his education. He didn't serve in the military because on the train to boot camp, World War I ended.

He married Edna Marie Petersen in 1947 and moved to Sandy. He worked at Koch's lumber mill, where

he stayed until his retirement in 1962. After retiring, he worked as a security guard for the Harris mill in Boring. Mr. Willcoxon remarried in 1960 after the death of his wife.

He is survived by his wife, Goldene of Sandy; four children, Lael Boitano of Estacada, Orie James and Charles E. Willcoxon, both of Portland, and Myrna Lea of Sandy; two stepchildren, Joseph Johnson of California and Francis Galle Waldron of Estacada; 17 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

NOTICE OF ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a special election to be held on Tuesday, June 28, 1983, between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M., there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the following districts the following questions:

SANDY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT #46

QUESTION: Shall the Sandy Elementary District levy \$1,980,914 outside Oregon's Constitutional limitation for operating expenses during the 1983-'84 fiscal year?

PURPOSE: The establishment of this levy is for funding the educational programs for the children of the district in grades one through eight. The Cedar Ridge, Firwood, Kelsco, and Sandy Elementary buildings are included in this operating proposal.

The district does not have a tax base to provide the educational program required by the State Constitution and State Statute as adopted by the District board, therefore, this operating levy is being presented for voter approval.

If this measure is approved \$1,786,582 of the taxes levied in the 1983-'84 fiscal year are eligible for partial state funding. However, \$196,332 of the taxes will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial state payment.

WELCHES ELEMENTARY NO. 13 COMBINED A & B OPERATIONS LEVY

QUESTION: Shall Welches Elementary School District levy \$189,186 in excess of the statutory limitation for an operating levy for 1983-1984?

PURPOSE: These funds are to support existing programs and to provide new funding for a .5 FTE guidance counselor and a computer literacy program.

The district's tax base does not provide sufficient funds to support the district's programs.

If the measure is approved, \$28,909 of the taxes levied in the 1983-1984 fiscal year are eligible for partial state funding. However, \$160,277 of the taxes will be totally financed by local taxpayers without any partial state payment. The combined levies would cost approximately \$0.85 per \$1000 evaluation before applicable tax relief. We anticipate the total tax rate for next year to be approximately \$0.26 per \$1000 less than the current year.

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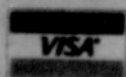
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
