Lamm to Emrich to Phillips.

In league play opponents have yet to score against BCI as they shut out Lynch 10-0 Tuesday night.

Boyd pitched the shutout and added two hits to the offensive cause.

Another home run by Tony Hale sparked the team in its fourth shutout.

Travel Tips

NOTES FROM U.S. CUSTOMS

Mike Ingrisano and Charlie Warren of U.S. Customs are warning travelers to select "legitimate" merchants when shopping. Too many trademarks and trade names are counterfeited, and the buyer becomes the innocent victim. Counterfeit articles are seized by U.S. Customs Inspectors, and the unknowing buyer suffers because such items are immediately confiscated with no recompense to the purchaser.

How widespread is counterfeiting? Well, here's what the U.S. NEWS AND WORLD REPORT had to say:

"For every Cartier watch sold, there are thought to be 15 or so imitations . . .

"Some textile mills in northern Italy are reporting turning out 3,500 miles of cloth a year with imitation LOUIS VUITTON insignia for use in luggage . . .

"Martini & Rossi, a beverage firm has 300 cases pending in Italy alone over illicit use of its trademark. Other sufferers include GUCCI . . .

Customs also has a new gimmick to help speed up inspections. O'Hare Airport in Chicago is the first one to receive a passport reader, designed for use with the new computer readable passports.

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About performance at nationals

District champ 'disappointed'

In her third NAAIA national meet in one school year, Gayle Roth of Boring failed to qualify in the 800-meter run for the semifinals. She was in Charleston, West Virginia.

"I missed it by about a nose," said Roth, who recently completed her freshman year at Willamette University, Salem.

She said her coach, Chuck Bowles, was disappointed as he'd only taken two athletes out of five qualifiers to the national meet, those he thought had a chance of doing well.

Roth said, "I was disappointed, too. I was hoping for a place in the finals."

Roth qualified by winning the 800 at the NAAIA District 2 Track and Field Championships in Salem May 13-14. The WU men's and women's teams won championships.

Roth won with a 2:17.2, a

season's best. She set her personal record as a senior at Sandy High, when she won the district title with a 2:15.

She said she felt good the week before the meet, and the day before the 800 trials, but not on the day of the meet. She said it was humid, "but usually I like the heat."

Her plan was to hold on and outkick the fifth-place

woman, which would have earned her a berth in the semifinals. She said she waited too long, however, and with 100 meters left it was too late, considering the slow pace. Roth ran a 2:19.

Last fall she finished 62nd at the NAAIA national cross country meet in Kenosha, Wis. At the national swim meet in Arkadelphia, Ark., Roth

was second in the 50 free and on the national championship 200 medley relay team.

She'll work locally driving a berry machine this summer, and may compete in a triathlon (swimming, running and bicycling) or two this summer.

Asked if she had bicycling experience, she said, "I rode to my boyfriend's house a lot."



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
