Funeral services for 18-year-old Dana Wayne Hodge were held June 11 in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Vault interment followed at Cliffside Cemetery.

He died June 7 in an automobile accident near Austin Hot Springs, east of Estacada.

Born Nov. 15, 1964 in Scottsbluff, Neb., he moved to Portland with his family when he was 6 years old and began his schooling. They moved to the Sandy area when Dana was in the seventh grade and he completed his elementary

education before entering Sandy High School.

Ralph Young

Former Sandy resident Ralph Young died June 11 at his Beaverton home. He was 79.

Funeral services were held June 14 in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Interment followed at the Cliffside Cemetery in Sandy.

Mr. Young was born April 24, 1904 in Hannibal, Mo. He was raised in Missouri and married Louise Teninty there on Dec. 19, 1925.

They lived in Illinois where Mr. Young worked for Armour Meats until

1927 before moving to Wyoming to work in the mining industry.

They moved to Astoria in 1938 and to Portland in 1942 where he worked as a sheetmetal worker. Since 1946 they have lived in Beaverton, except for seven years in the 1970s when they lived near Sandy.

Mr. Young retired from sheetmetal work in 1964 due to health reasons.

He is survived by his wife, Louise of Beaverton; a son, John of Portland; two daughters, Doris Smith of Beaverton and Linda Palmer of San Diego, Calif.; 13 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.

First Sandy Baptist pastor visits

Members and friends of Sandy Baptist Church will welcome back Dr. Edward Rodda next Sunday.

Rodda was Sandy Baptist's first pastor 37 years ago. He spent three years in Sandy and during that time the church built its first sanctuary, which was located directly in front of the current Sandy Senior Center.

Some lumber used in the construction was logged,

taken to the sawmill and nailed in place all in the same day.

Since Rodda and his family, including daughters Susan, Nancy and Hope, left Sandy, he has served several pastorates, the last being The First Baptist Church of Hemet, Calif.

Rodda retired from the ministry on Jan. 1, 1982 after watching the congregation grow from 275 in

1958 to 1,850 in 1982.

Rodda will be honored as the church celebrates its 37th anniversary. He will speak at the 11 a.m. service on "How to Build a Successful Church."

An anniversary potluck at 1:15 p.m. will continue the festivities following the morning service. Each family is asked to bring enough chicken for the family, one pie or strawberries and short-

cake, their own table service and tablecloth. Additional fare will be provided.

Following the family potluck, the day will conclude with a message from Rodda and special music from the Voice of Triumph who hails from the First Baptist Church of Milwaukee and is directed by Dr. Gordon Borrer, assistant professor of Church Music at Western Baptist Seminary.
