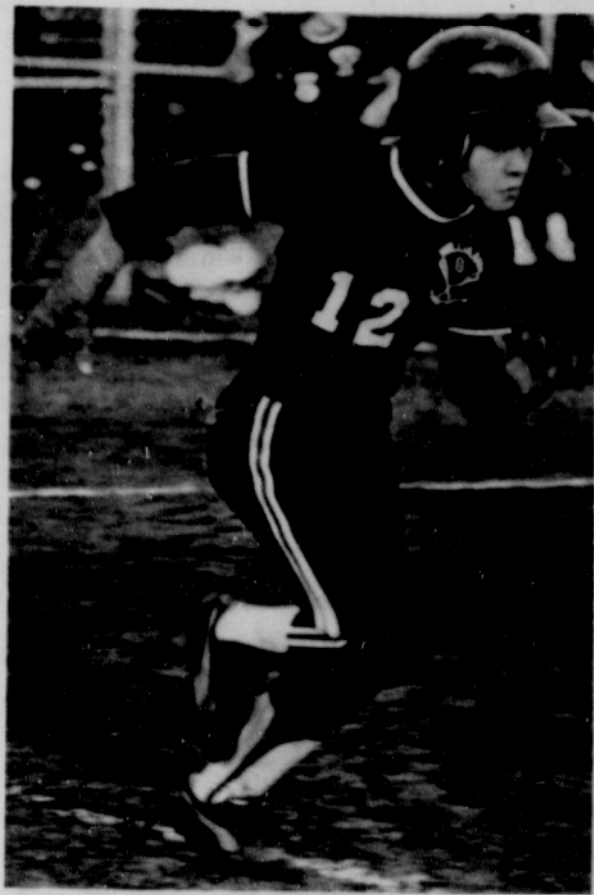

JRC Construction wins close one

JRC Construction of Sandy upped its record with a nine-inning, 7-6 win over Reynolds and a 9-2 win over Rockwood Six in recent Junior Federal league play.

They are 6-2 in league, 8-3 overall.

In a tight game with Reynolds, JRC Construction took a 3-1 first-inning

lead on singles by Gary Copher, Jason Curtis and Paul Gunderson.

In the third inning four Sandy errors helped provide Reynolds with four runs.

Ty Beckley then went in to pitch, allowing only one hit and three walks and striking out nine.

It was his "best game of

the season," said Coach Carl Brinkley.

In the bottom of the ninth, Ryan Sweeney got a bunt single, stole second and third, and scored on Jerry Brinkley's "perfect" bunt to win the game on a squeeze play.

Against Rockwood Six, JRC Construction led off with Beckley's base on balls, a steal of second and a score on Gary Copher's sacrifice.

In the third inning Rockwood benefited from three walks and three errors, taking a 2-1 lead.

Copher went into the game to pitch the final three and one-third innings, allowing only one hit and taking the win.

In the fourth inning JRC Construction scored three runs, with Curtis doubling home Gary and Dave Copher.

In the fifth inning Brinkley singled home Sweeney. Dave Copher doubled home Tim Miller and Beckley, and Sweeney singled home Gary and Dave Copher. Brinkley topped off the scoring when he singled Jason Curtis.

The 16-14 win by the Caps was their first of the season.



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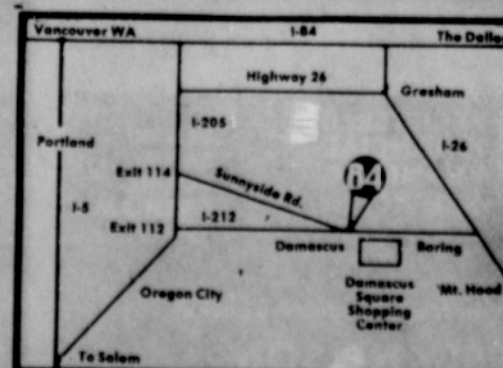
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
