Review board lists first honorees

The Sandy Design Review Board kicked off its list of merit award recipients last week citing six local facilities for the work they've done making Sandy a visually appealing place to live.

The awards—divided among commercial, industrial, residential and institutions—were based on building, landscaping and signage.

Overall honorees were Benj. Franklin Savings and Loan, Baert's Metal Products, Cedar Park Gardens and St. Michael's Catholic Church.

Cited for building and landscaping was the United Bank of Sandy. El Casa Grande received a certificate for its sign.

In other action, the Design Review Board:

—Approved construction of a wine-tasting room on the west end of Janz Berryland.

—Approved remodeling of the office building on Strauss Avenue between Benj. Franklin and Health House. It will become offices and sales space for Solar Max.

—Approved landscaping for the new McDonald's restaurant on the west end of Sandy.

—Approved Sandy Community Action Center's application to wall in the loading dock on their new home at the site of the former Sandy post office.

—Approved an addition for E.W. Eldridge Inc. offices in Sandy Industrial Park.

—Approved design of a new sign for Otto's Ski Shop.
