

Students accept SUHS challenge

A record number of students took and passed challenge tests at Sandy High School recently.

According to Dennis Crow, assistant principal, about 110 students took 130 challenge exams. "In terms of the interest shown, and conduct and attitude, this is the best group we've ever had," Crow said.

Because students can successfully receive credit on their high school transcripts and take more advanced classes, Crow said school officials believe "it's necessary that (the challenge process) be rigorous."

Students from the five elementary feeder districts, as well as those already in high school, have the opportunity to test out of unified science, geography, and a number of mathematics, English and foreign language courses as well as typing, civics, U.S. history and world cultures.

This marked the fourth year the tests were given. They are administered twice annually and primarily eighth graders take them.

The success rate usually falls in the 10 percent range. The success rate is low because, Crow pointed out, "the tests are tough."

This year topped the average, however, with a 15 percent success rate.

"The results were excellent," Crow said. "I think that's a real credit to our feeder schools for the preparation they've

given the students."

Students from each feeder district successfully passed challenge tests, Crow said. Nineteen students successfully challenged altogether.

Meleta Hooley, who attended Cedar Ridge and will enter SUHS in the fall, received the highest score ever on an exam, scoring 96 percent on the algebra I test.

Hooley, the daughter of David and Cheryl Hooley, was one of three students to pass the exam. The others were Gerald Hale (son of Gerald and Joyce

Hale) and Wendy Cox (daughter of Kent and Sharron Cox). They also attended Cedar Ridge.

Hooley and Cox are both involved in vocal and instrumental music, and Cox also likes to go sailing. Hale enjoys baseball, football, basketball and fishing, and plays the trombone.

Crow added it was "amazing" that seven Cedar Ridge students passed first-year Spanish.

One student passed unified science, two passed

ed geography, three passed applied math and three passed English I.

Some students scored well enough in the challenges to be placed in higher-level classes, although they won't receive credit.

For example, some students did well enough in the unified science exam to enroll in biology this fall. However, they won't receive credit for unified science, a course most of their classmates will take.

Task force targets areas

Special unit attacks crime

A special unit, formed by the Clackamas County Sheriff's Department, is mounting an attack in areas with exceptional crime in the county.

Sheriff Paul McAllister formed the unit to provide concentrated patrol and community involvement in specifically targeted areas.

The unit, named TRAP (Tactical Response and Accent Patrol), is made up of personnel from the department's Crime Analysis Unit, Crime Prevention Unit and Uniform Patrol Division.

"The key to the success of the TRAP unit will be the rapid assessment of the crime problem in a particular area, and the involvement of the community to assist enhanced patrol efforts," according to Neil James, public information officer for the sheriff's department.

The unit uses information gained when specific crime patterns or problem areas are identified by the Crime Analysis Unit through the new computerized records system.

The first area identified

by the TRAP unit concerns a rash of thefts involving outboard motors.

During the past six months, 46 motors have been reported stolen in the county. Twenty-six percent of the thefts occurred in the Boring-Damascus area. None have been recovered.

The sheriff's office recommends that boat owners not leave their boats where they are easily accessible from the street, and that outboard motors be removed from the boat and stored.

Strategies are being developed to coordinate the functions of the three groups to utilize continuing analysis of the problem, community awareness and information, and the enhanced patrol functions in the particular areas of the county.

Captain Ris Bridshaw and Lt. Lonnie Ryan will coordinate and supervise the TRAP unit. Dave Broomfield, the department's crime analyst, will work with the unit along with a crime prevention of-

ficer. Currently, two Patrol Division Officers are assigned to the unit.

"Although cooperation between various sheriff's office units is routine insofar as providing services and in criminal investigations," said James, "the structured nature of the TRAP unit will add a specific process and procedure that will more quickly identify and implement appropriate preventive and enforcement responses to exceptional crime areas."

Interment was private at the Cliffside Cemetery in Sandy.



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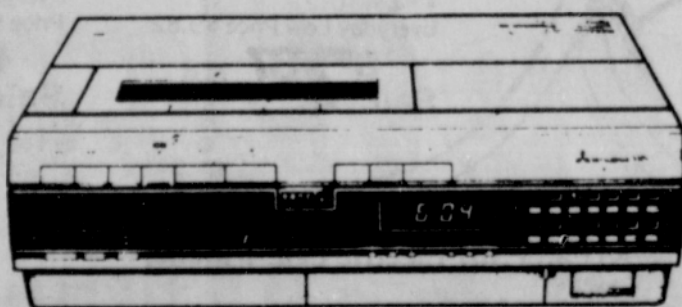
