Children with matches set Sandy house afire

Two children learned about the dangers of playing with matches the hard way when they started a fire that destroyed one room and burned through the roof of a Sandy home Saturday evening.

One of the children and the owner of the home were taken to Gresham Community Hospital where they were treated and released.

According to Sandy Fire Marshal Jim Gallagher, two children, ages 7 and 8, were playing with matches in a second-story bedroom at the Audie McKinnon family home, 38530 Pioneer Blvd. They ignited some papers and put them under mattresses which in turn caught the mattresses on fire.

The elder McKinnon and one of the children were taken to the hospital. McKinnon was treated for

smoke inhalation and released.

The child was checked for a possible broken foot, sustained when he jumped from the second-story room, and released.

The fire occurred at 11:40 p.m., Gallagher said. He estimated \$5,000 damage to the house and a \$2,000 loss to the house's

contents.

Friday evening, local firefighters answered a fire call at a residence at the intersection of Lusted and Thomas Roads.

A chicken shed, valued at approximately \$250, was destroyed after a light bulb came in contact with some combustible materials and caught fire.
