



People make a parade

More bands and commercial entries than ever before filled the parade route last Thursday of the annual Sandy Mountain Days parade.

Led by Grand Marshal Cheryl Hansen, co-host of "PM Magazine" on KGW-TV, the parade of more than 100 entries remembered the "Decade on the Mountain," celebrating the 10th anniversary of the annual Mountain Festival.
