Book helps kids survive life alone

From the shelves of Sandy Public Library comes "In Charge, A Complete Handbook for Kids with Working Parents" by Susan Derrick.

Before you can take charge of any situation, you need to know what the situation is. You're not alone. Every day kids are doing things they've never had to do before.

They can make beds, breakfasts, even decisions! Direct, upbeat, easy to use, this handbook is a crash course in all aspects of self-sufficiency.

Undeniably needed, and necessary, and sensible and reassuring. This book is a must for working and non-working parents alike. "Left Brain, Right Brain," by Sally P. Stringer and Georg Deutsch, is an attempt to bring the dramatic split-brain operatins of the 1960s to readers with little or no exposure to neuropsychology. Throughout the authors carefully separate fact from speculation, present

the basic findings on asymmetry in brain-damaged, split-brain and normal subjects. The book discusses topics

such as left-handedness, learning disabilities, sex difference in higher mental functions and theories of consciousness.
