

At Bull Run School

Busing plans change hours

Bull Run School Board last Saturday reviewed a new student handbook and a consolidated districts' bus plan, raised lunch prices and set new school hours.

To offset heavy district subsidy for hot lunches that actually cost the school \$1 and more, the board raised prices from 50 cents to 55 cents for grades one through six and 60 cents for grades seven and eight.

The board agreed to

review the increases twice in the coming school year.

"I think we're between a hard place and a rock," board member Dave Shaw said of the increases. "We don't have any choice."

Anticipated bus pooling with Sandy High and Sandy Elementary forces other changes in school hours, according to Superintendent Wes Jahn.

He is changing Bull Run School hours to 9 a.m. until 3:20 p.m., although he said students could be in school

even 10 minutes less than these abbreviated hours.

Leasing the district's sole bus to the consolidated districts' bus pool and then contracting for service from the pool should trim 45 minutes wait some Bull Run bus riders have experienced.

Bull Run, then, doesn't want children at school until 8:45 a.m.

Board goals for the coming year include working out the consolidated transportation plan and a school plan with communi-

ty representation.

Board member Marty Stewart also suggested more community use of the school after hours, perhaps for adult education classes through the community college.

Board chairman Karen Rollins proposed one local community club board member sit on the new school plan committee, with a corresponding school board member attending community club meetings.

Rites today for Boring veteran

Ralph E. Williams of Boring, vice president and general manager of Automotive Industrial Marketing Corp. where he had been employed for the past 17 years, died Tuesday in a Portland hospital. He was 62.

Funeral will be at 10 a.m. today, Aug. 18, at the Gresham Latter-day Saints Stake Center, 3500 SE 182nd Ave. Vault interment will be at Sandy Ridge Cemetery.

Mr. Williams was born Nov. 3, 1920, in Watsonville, Calif. He grew up in California, where he enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He served in World War II and the Korean War. He moved to Portland in 1966.

He married Betty Ann Broderick on Jan. 26, 1946, in Stockton, Calif. Their marriage was solemnized in the Salt Lake Temple on Sept. 15, 1947. He was an active member of the Sandy First Ward Latter Day Saints Church and served on the High Council of the Gresham South Stake.

He loved dancing and was a dance instructor. He also was involved in genealogy.

He is survived by his wife, Betty, of Boring; two daughters, Marcy Delk of Vancouver, Wash., and Kathleen McNamee of Boring, and five grandsons.

Funeral services were held Saturday for longtime Sandy resident Hans Rathjen, 79, who died Aug. 9.

Mr. Rathjen, a resident of the Sandy area since 1929, was born April 30, 1904 in Jevensstedt, Germany. He moved to the United States as a young man. He raised berries and

dairy stock.

He married his wife, Myrtle, in Oregon City on Nov. 21, 1942.

Survivors include his wife; three children, Elise Keyser of Ketchikan, Alaska, Hans Rathjen Jr.

and George Rathjen, both of Sandy, and five stepchildren, Jean Hobvey in California, Muriel Hopkins of Clackamas, Addean Torrance of Oregon City, Freda Jantz of Estacada, and Clyde Tice of Portland.

Also surviving are a brother, Detlef Rathjen, and sister, Anna Rathjen, both in Germany. There are 11 grandchildren.

Interment was at Cliffside Cemetery in Sandy.
