

Tests a must for seniors

High school students who plan to attend college should begin making plans to take the SAT and ACT tests.

"It is imperative for college-bound seniors to take the SAT and/or the ACT," said Peggy Hart, senior counselor at SUHS.

She recommends students take both tests as college and university requirements vary as to which test is required and/or requested.

As of Jan. 24, 1983 the University of Oregon and Oregon State University required cumulative grade point averages of 2.75 or certain scores on the SAT or ACT.

Portland State University, Southern Oregon State College, Western Oregon State College and Eastern Oregon State College require cumulative grade point averages of 2.5 or the required level on the SAT

or ACT, and the Oregon Institute of Technology requires a cumulative grade point average of 2.25 or a certain score on the SAT or ACT.

The cumulative grade point average plus an acceptable score on the SAT or ACT is preferred, said Hart.

Admission to private schools or other colleges or universities may require higher test scores or GPAs.

The ACT will be offered at Sandy High School on Oct. 29. Cost is \$9.50.

The SAT will be offered at SUHS on Dec. 3. Cost is \$9.50.

The PSAT, a preliminary test for juniors, will be offered at SUHS on Oct. 22.

For more information students are advised to contact their counselors. Further information will be mailed to each senior at a later date.

Agency benefits presented

The Sandy city council heard a presentation on the advantages of using an advertising agency during its meeting Tuesday night.

Dan MacDonald of Sandy, executive vice president of The De Witz Association, Ltd., an advertising agency in Portland, told the council that he and his partner evaluate 117 pounds of computer printouts on media in the Portland area per month.

MacDonald said even small businesses can

benefit from the expertise of an advertising agency.

He pointed out that advertising agencies are paid on a commission by the media from whom they are purchasing space or time. Being a member of the community, he said he would be available to discuss the topic further should anyone be interested.

In other business, the council agreed unanimously to hire Mark White as a full-time officer with the Sandy police department.

White received the best score on a written exam in a test conducted at Oregon City, according to information provided to the council. Over 80 candidates took the test.

The council agreed unanimously to direct the city engineer to do a study

on the feasibility of a local improvement district to finance a sewer line that would extend from an existing sewer that crosses Sandy Heights Street west of the proposed Papa Bear subdivision to the west end of the Bluff Heights subdivision.

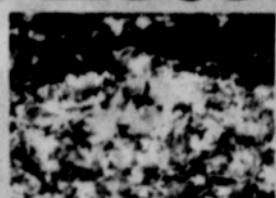
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Obituary

Funeral services for retired dairy farmer Andrew Von Bergen were held Wednesday, Sept. 7 in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Burial followed at Sandy Ridge Cemetery.

Mr. Von Bergen died in a Portland hospital on Sept. 4 at the age of 85.

He was born John Andrew Von Bergen in the Cedar Mills area of Portland on Nov. 30, 1897. When he was 10 his family moved to Camas, Wash., where he completed his education while working on the family farm.

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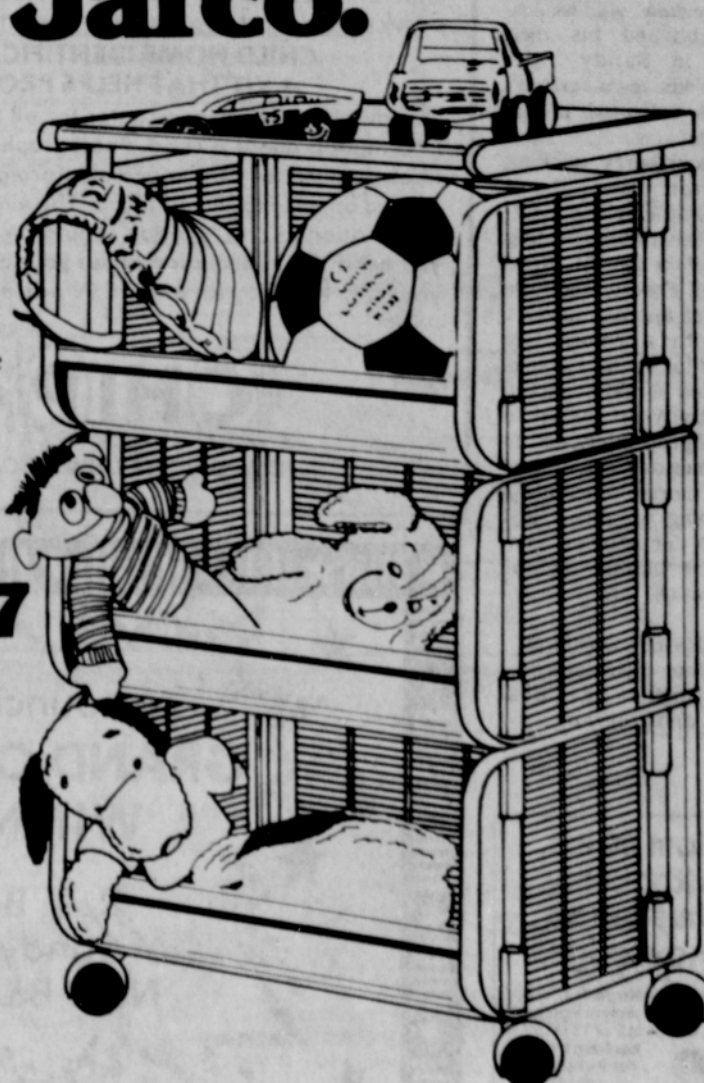
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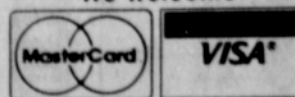
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
