Beall announces candidacy

Congressman Denny Smith may be facing a challenge from a former employee of the man Smith replaced, former Rep. Al Ullman.

Attorney Jim Beall, once a legislative aide to Ullman, is campaigning for the Democratic nomination for the 5th Congressional District seat.

Beall said a decrease in unemployment would be one of his primary goals.

"Oregon's greatest need now and in the years ahead will be jobs," Beall said.

"Small businessmen, those in the work force, farmers, the maritime industry, and manufacturers need help if markets are to be developed and demand created for Oregon goods and agricultural products," he said.

Beall said he would "welcome the opportunity to help in efforts to broaden Oregon's economic base and convince new, clean, job-producing industries to come here."

The campaign is already generating support from former Gov. Bob Straub, who has joined the effort as campaign manager.

Beall said his close ties to Oregon and his experience in Washington, D.C., as an aide would be beneficial as a congressman.

"My years in Washington working with members of Congress and its committees convinced me that those who accomplish the most for the people neither play the political game nor waste their energies preaching political ideology," he said.

"Oregonians want a representative in congress who will listen to them, will

fight for their interests, and work to solve such dissimilar problems as high taxes and crime," said Beall.

Beall was born in Corvallis, attended high school in Hillsboro, was an undergraduate at Oregon State University and received his law degree from the University of Oregon.

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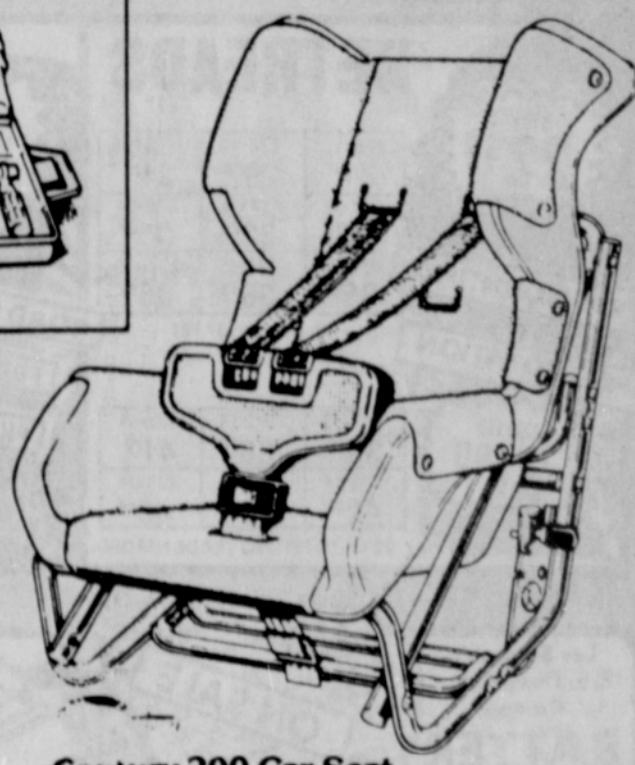
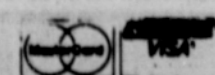
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
