Veda Rickman dies at 87 years old

Veda Myrtle Rickman of Troutdale, died Dec. 20 in a Portland nursing home. She was 87 years old.

She was born Veda Myrtle Hanline on May 28, 1896 in Grafton, West Virginia, where she received her early education. She left West Virginia as a child and settled in Nevada on a homestead.

At age 18 she married Thomas Rickman. She lived a short time in Utah before coming to Klamath Falls, Oregon. She settled in Portland until 1957 when she came to Gresham as well as spending some time on a farm near Sandy. During the war years she worked in the shipyards. She also worked in canneries as well as being a homemaker.

During her leisure time, she loved to travel. She also enjoyed reading and doing fancy needlework.

Her husband, Thomas, preceded her in death in 1957. Mrs. Rickman had been in ill health for the past three months.

Survivors include four sons, Charles of Sandy, Fred of Gresham, David in Lakeside and Michael in Portland; three daughters, Myrtle Chatelain of Troutdale, Barbara Proden of Sacramento, California and Bessie Ballard of Hoodport, Washington. Also surviving are two sisters, Minnie Jensen and Ethel Rigby, both of Brigham City, Utah. There are 15 grandchildren, 18 great-grandchildren and seven great-great-grandchildren.

Private interment will be at Rose City Cemetery in Portland.

Survivors include his wife, Elnora, of Gresham; a son, Fred of Gresham and three daughters, Mrs. Diana Hansen of LaPine, Mrs. Joanna Ratton of Portland and Janice Fischer of Sandy. There are 12 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. Also surviving are four sisters, Mae Seekins of Gresham, Bertha Minter, Dora Fisher and Stella Cunningham, all of Boring.

Funeral services will be Thursday, Dec. 29 at 2 p.m. in the Chapel of Carroll Funeral Home in Gresham. Private vault interment will be at Forest Lawn Cemetery in Gresham. There will be no procession to the cemetery.
