Loren Bateman and Tony Barnes each won Mt. Hood Conference wrestling titles for SUHS in February. Five Sandy wrestlers placed in the district meet and Bateman went on to take third in state.

Sharon Jensen was named first team all-league as the SUHS girls basketball team finished the season with a 11-9 record, the best in the program's seven-year history, and the swim team placed second in district, sending four members to state.

The boys basketball team also narrowly missed the playoffs, with Steve Pettingill receiving all-league honors.

The ski team at SUHS added the Mt. Hood Trophy to its honors for the third straight year.

MARCH

If the standard set by the SUHS ski team is met in the near future, chances are it will be by Sandy again.

Establishing themselves as a perennial power throughout the season, the team posted an incredible sweep in all four categories of the state competition. Ulla Pearson and

Steve Sarich were individual champions and both boys and girls won team titles.

Though favored in the girls races, the boys team was a question mark until the end.

"Everyone had to go for it," said Coach Rob Karsten, "we just sent them down and let 'em rip."

Also in March, SUHS graduate Gayle Roth led Willamette University to fourth in NAIA Division I swim championships.

Buckboard Pizza scored 124 points to stay on top of the "C" Division basketball standings, and U.S. Metals knocked Thriftway from the top of the "B" Division.

APRIL

A new football coach was named at SUHS. Mike Funderburg, defensive coordinator at Ontario High School was chosen to take the helm for the Pioneers.

Donkey basketball and the Sandy Alumni Basketball Tournament kept things busy in the high school gym. A new champion was crowned in each division at the tourney.

The 1971-72 team won back the title they had lost last year in the A division. In the B division, a team comprised of past and present coaches took the title with enough ease to pose a threat in the A division this year. Scott Cravens and Pat Baird were named MVPs for the tournament.

The SUHS baseball team got a 5-3 win over top-ten ranked The Dalles, and the girls softball team bested Centennial 5-1 for its first win.

The best in the state showed up for the Sandy Invitational track meet, strengthening its reputation as one of the finest meets in the state.

The Special Olympics were a big hit on Mt. Hood, drawing many in the community for support.

The SUHS girls track meet handed Barlow its first dual meet loss in seven years. On the boys side Sam Romey got four firsts in a 66-42 win over Parkrose.

MAY

Powder Puff Football opened May, with Juniors beating Seniors in the annual event.

Sharon Jensen was tabbed to play in the Metro-State All-Star basketball games and the SUHS thincads headed for the MHC district meet.

The district meet was a show for Sam Romey, with Romey winning the 1500, the 800, and ran the anchor leg of the state qualifying 1600 relay. Chris Muff and Wendy Coleman took first and second in the javelin for the girls.

At the state meet, Denise Proctor was third in the shot and Romey finished fourth in the 800.

JUNE

Softball district champions included Clackamas County Bank and Paola's. CCB also won a second place in Junior division. The Welches Stings won in the B division.

The boys won the Junior National trophy, the Junior Federal trophy and the Senior Federal trophy. Both Federal teams posted only one loss during the regular season.

AUGUST

Williams Thriftway grabbed the state title in Junior Baseball, and Bruce Cook Ins. got third in Seniors.

Four players from two Sandy women's soccer teams were picked for a select over-30 team. Toni Stanhope, Gail Gardner, Laurie Espenel and Cathi Langley competed in Canada and Seattle for the team.

The SUHS football team opened practice first in the state with a 12:01 a.m. practice.

The SUHS volleyball team picked up a fifth in state ranking and the football team picked up wins over Parkrose and Reynolds.

Both boys and girls soccer teams picked on Roosevelt, with each team getting a comfortable win.

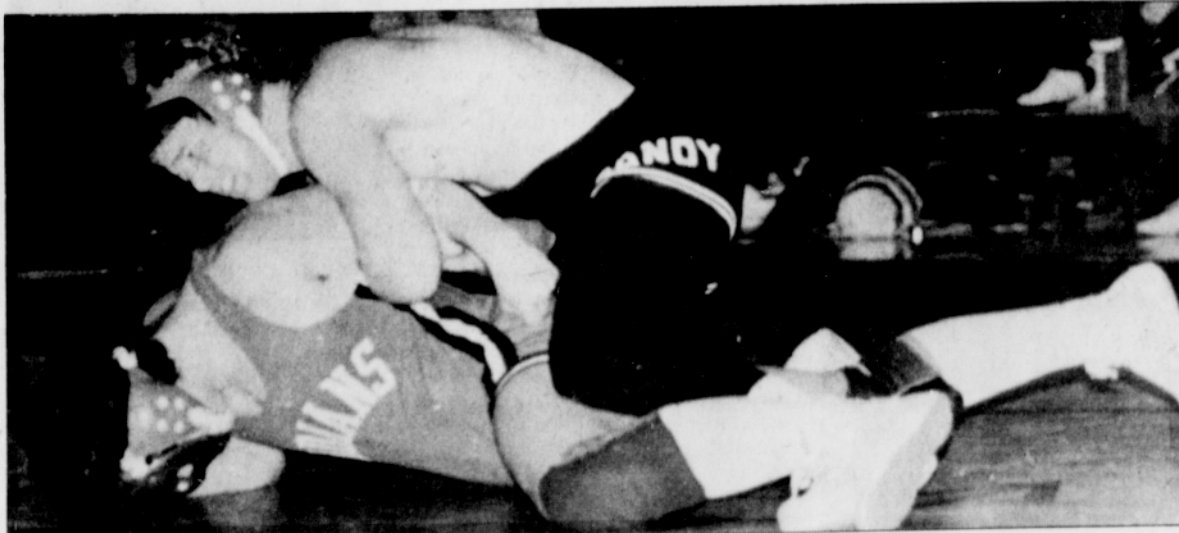
OCTOBER
