Woman celebrates 100th

Clara Moore has no secrets on why she's reached her 100th year of life.

"I don't know," she ponders in her chair at Centennial Care Center, 725 SE 202nd Ave. "I just grew up."

That growing up was filled with fun, she says. She was born Jan. 27, 1885, in Virgil City, Missouri. As a young girl she and her family traveled by wagon train to Texas. She remembers their wagon crossing a river on that journey and getting swirled into quicksand.

"I remember a man telling my father, 'don't stop for anything' and we didn't," she says.

After a time in Texas and then a

move to Kansas, Moore married Carl Moore when she was 27. The couple moved to Portland in 1918.

"I met my husband sitting on a bench at a music fair."

Moore has outlived both her husband and their one daughter and one of their two grandchildren. She has five great-grandchildren.

Moore remembers seeing wide changes in the way she lived her 100 years. She remembers switching from wood stove to electric stove, however, "biscuits are better made on a wood stove," she maintains.

She remembers the outdated outhouse and having to "go outside

on a cold night and freeze your toes." Indoor plumbing, she says, was "pretty keen."

For her birthday dinner the staff at her care center plans to give her just what she's requested. "Speck's Chicken," better known now as Kentucky Fried Chicken. She's never had the colonel's new biscuits made by the restaurant.

"But I bet they aren't as good as mine," she says.

in the cemetery they cared for," noted Loomis in her report.

Many of the names carved on the gravestones also are borne by roads in the Damascus area, she added. They include Aemisegger, Bohna, Winston, Schacht, Rodlun, Hoffmeister, Andersen, Telford, Chitwood, Tillstrom, Weise and Richey.

Not all those buried in the cemetery are identified. Temporary markers erected at some gravesites have disappeared or been vandalized, leaving no indication of who is buried there. Other graves were well-marked, with family members clustered together.

Loomis found herself piecing together bits of people's lives during her tours of the cemetery.

"You tried to," she says. "You could figure out (that) she was the wife of so-and-so and these were their children. You could figure out relationships."

Often, Hoffmeister would tell her some of the history relating to a particular person.

"Dora seems to have a photographic memory on a lot of things," says

Loomis.

When she presented her report to the garden club, one member recalled how, as a child, she played in the cemetery while her father poured concrete footings for fences surrounding some plots. Another remembered when deer and livestock roamed through the property, a primary reason for the fences.

Loomis found only one plot still enclosed by a wrought iron fence, and it is damaged. The end of one side has been torn loose and moved a few feet. She speculates the fence was damaged when someone tried to steal it.

While elaborate headstones are erected above many of the graves, others are quite simple and touching. One recent grave is marked by a length of tree limb crossed with a rough board. A name is carved crudely but lovingly in the wood.

Tiny markers, some heart-shaped, others adorned with stone lambs or other ornamentation, testify to the high infant mortality rate of bygone days. Hoffmeister remembers when the nearest doctor "was miles away in Portland, a long trip by wagon or carriage," wrote Loomis.

Others buried in Damascus lived long lives. One such person was Louise Boese, who died in 1886. She was born in 1800, the earliest birthdate noted in cemetery records.

In addition to the date of birth and death, many headstones record the number of years, months and days the person buried beneath them lived. They often bear poetic inscriptions as well, such as:

"Oh cease, dear parents, cease your weeping.

Above the spot where I am sleeping.

My time was short and blessed be That called me to eternity."

Many older graves have footstones as well as headstones. And Loomis discovered that most of the early gravestones faced east.

Council positions are open

The time is right for people interested in local government to get involved.

Two positions are currently open on the Sandy City Council. Jim Griffin recently resigned his position, citing a lack of time because of the demands of his job. He has also moved out of the city limits.

It is assumed the other position is Dr. Tim Ward's. At a recent City Council meeting Mayor Deane Wessellink said two positions are open. Ward did not attend the Jan. 7 swearing in. He has been unavailable for comment.

There are two years remaining to be served on Griffin's term. There are four years remaining on Ward's.

Calvin Jones, who has served one four year term and was unsuccessful in his bid for re-election in November, was appointed to fill the unexpired two-year term held by Wessellink, who was elected mayor.

Other City Councilors are Jim Duff, Dick Harrison and Marge Frederickson.

There is also a position open on the Sandy Planning Commission.

Kimberly Nelson was recently appointed to fill the unexpired term of Linda Daniels, who had one year remaining to serve. She moved out of the urban growth area. Marian James was recently appointed to fill another four-year term.

Other Planning Commission members are Bill Sundin, chairman, Randy Oliver, Kathy Abbott and John Fork.
