

Former resident in top office

Jerry Young of Albany, who attended Sandy area schools, was elected potentate of Al Kader Shrine Temple at the annual January meeting.

He will serve the 1985 term as the chief executive of the Al Kader, which has its headquarters in Portland. It is an organization comprising about 5,500 members with 30 Shrine Clubs located throughout the state.

Young is a native of Spokane. His family moved to Oregon when he was young and he attended schools in Sandy. He was chosen to play on the Metro team in the Shrine All-Star game of 1955.

Young attended Montana State University, where he joined Theta Chi Fraternity and graduated with a bachelor's degree. He continued his education at Oregon State University, where he earned a master's degree.

Young was football coach at Albany High School from 1960 to 1964.

He later became a franchise holder for Kentucky Fried Chicken, and was elected president of the Adversiting Committee of his region. He was advanced to the National Board of KFC, at which time the organization expanded rapidly throughout the world.

Young has recently moved into other fast-food organizations and is currently an operator of Taco Johns, with franchises in the Albany area and in the Willamette Valley.

Young is a member of the Albany Chamber of Commerce and the Oregon State Beaver Club. His Masonic affiliations include St. Johns Lodge in Albany and advanced degrees in Salem and Albany. He has been a Shriner since 1976 and has served on the Temple Divan since 1977.

Al Kader Temple is but one of the 185 Shrine Temples located throughout North America. Memberships total about one million.

The Shrine of North America has build and maintains 22 hospitals for

crippled or burned children, with one in Portland, relocated on Marquam Hill in 1983 at a cost of over \$22 million. Cost of operating the 22

Shrine hospitals exceeds \$175,000,000 annually, with the funds accrued from, or by, the efforts of Shriners throughout the continent.
