Decision on Bull Run water delayed until late March

A decision on whether or not the Portland Water Bureau will be allowed to divert water from the Bull Run River for hydroelectric generation purposes will be delayed until late March.

Steven Brutscher, staff member for the Oregon Water Policy Review Board, said recently that the decision, originally expected in late February, had been delayed to allow the staff more time to prepare for the meeting.

Brutscher expects the board to render a decision at its March 21 meeting, which is tentatively scheduled in Eugene.

The hearing on the matter of the diversion was held Dec. 2 with ten parties, mostly representing environmental and recreational groups, testifying that the water bureau's plan to divert water from the Bull Run River would seriously harm the fishing and recreational values in the Sandy River, which is fed by the Bull Run.

The water bureau proposes to take 170 cubic feet of water per second from Bull Run, reducing the Sandy by 3 to 5 percent. The water will be piped to generators already in place near Northeast 162nd Avenue and Airport Way.

The original hearing on the project began in 1982. However, environmen-

tal groups contended that they were not adequately notified of the plan and put together a last-minute petition to testify in the matter last summer.
