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"The service to the kids has to be a high priority, we need to provide above and beyond the classroom," he said.

Students are also the focus in a proposal for an assistant principal position to be created at Cedar Ridge, said Principal Randi Leuthold.

"An assistant principal would take over the direct areas involving students," said Leuthold.

These areas would include attendance, discipline, student supervision and student activities and athletics, according to Leuthold.

Leuthold said an assistant principal would enable her to concentrate on staff development and improvement of curriculum and instruction.

She said that many of the duties that would be handled by an assistant principal are spread throughout the school.

"The teachers are doing a lot of ex-

tra work," she said.

Leuthold said combining the different areas would be more efficient.

"Everything that is in the interests of the students should be coordinated rather than spread throughout the building," she said.

"We want the place to be as successful for students as possible," said Leuthold.

Other new proposals this year include additional parking at Kelso School, elevating a problem chimney at Sandy Grade School, and other minor renovation at Sandy Grade.

The board has also proposed finishing a self-contained kitchen at Firwood.

"We want to get away from the business of transporting food," said Lund.

He said a self-contained kitchen would enable a more logically planned school day, rather than planning around the meal deliveries.

"Right now we are doing it kind of backwards," he said.

Other proposals are for single ownership of the bus fleet (excluding the Bull Run interest), and a study for converting the heating system at Firwood School.
