Alert Sandy man spots federal fugitive

Gene Hiatt turned what could have been just another gun sale into the arrest of one of the most sought after fugitives in the country.

Hiatt, a clerk at Larry's Sport Center, tipped off police when Arvidis Julius Kiperts, 52, no known address, entered the store at about 4:45 p.m. Sunday. Kiperts was among the 15 most wanted fugitives sought by the U.S. Marshals Service.

Hiatt said Kiperts was interested in expensive handguns when he shopped at the store.

"His accent really tipped me off," Hiatt said. The wanted poster, the only one at Larry's, said Kiperts had a German-sounding accent. Kiperts is from Latvia, a nation under Soviet influence which is located north of Poland on the Baltic Sea.

"I've been watching for that guy," Hiatt said. "The U.S. Marshals sent out the notice six weeks ago."

Information with the wanted poster said Kiperts was interested in handguns, a fact that was not lost on the wary Hiatt.

"He resembled his poster," Hiatt said. "He was a little heavier and had no mustache. I showed it to another clerk just to make sure."

Gresham police were called and four of them entered the store at 310 S.W. Burnside. They contacted Kiperts, who produced identification saying he was Neil Keith Kruger. A deputy from the U.S. Marshals office in Portland was called in to make positive identification.

Kiperts was wanted for violation of parole issued in Memphis, Tenn., where he was released from prison in August 1984 after serving 10 years of a 36-year sentence.

Kiperts is also a suspect in several bank robberies in Oregon that occur-

red shortly after he was paroled, the Portland FBI office confirmed.

Hiatt has only worked at Larry's for six months. He previously worked in the service department at Carlson Chevrolet in Sandy, said the Sandy resident.

"I'm just glad he wasn't just another customer," Hiatt said. "It would have been embarrassing if I would have been wrong."

Hiatt didn't realize that Kiperts was a bank robber.

"I didn't realize he was that desperate," Hiatt said. "I heard he is a suspect in 45 bank robberies. He was a real gentleman, nicely dressed."
