Manager glad to be in Sandy

After working at approximately nine different stores in the past nine years, Tom Myron is anxious to stay put for a while.

Myron, manager of the Sandy Sprouse Reitz store, said he likes the challenge of his job. He was at one store in Sacramento for 10 months, and saw sales pick up 35 percent.

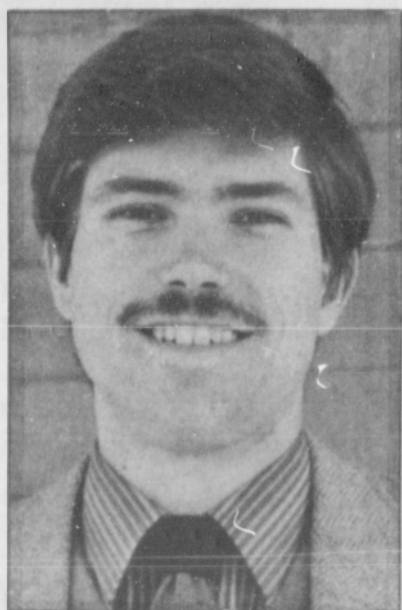
But after eight years of trouble-shooting in California, Myron asked to be transferred back to Oregon. "I missed it," he said. "Especially when you grow up here, it gets in your blood."

He said Sandy reminds him of Hillsboro when he was growing up. He and his wife, Linda, plan to move the family here after they finish up the school year in Hillsboro. He had been working at Cedar Mills before the Sandy store opened up.

Their children are Trina, 13, Tanya, 11, and Christopher, 4.

"I have to give a lot of credit to them, and a lot to my wife. She's been very patient."

He said he has heard some negative comments about the shopping center, Sandy Marketplace. "We didn't come into town to put anybody

out of business," he said, adding that if they can keep shoppers in Sandy, everyone should benefit. "We want to be a big part of the community."

"Especially since I plan on living here. I want it to be a nice town."

He described Sprouse Reitz as a business moving toward the "junior department store look" instead of being just a variety store.

He pointed out they have crafts, sewing items, drapes, bedding, curtains, rugs — everything from the bedroom to the kitchen.

There are the other items one would normally expect at a department store, from hardware and auto parts to toys. The ready-to-wear section has proven popular also, Myron said.

The Sandy store is just a little over 15,000 square feet, and is one of the company's model stores. Managers, district managers and buyers were to be in the store Wednesday looking at the new layout.

The new store has 10 employees, and will probably have about 15 people full time in the near future.

Sprouse Reitz has 325 stores in 11 western states, with its home office in Portland. The company is in its 76th year.

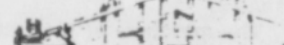
