Funeral services for Joseph L. Ozanne, 92, of Brightwood, were held last week at the Bateman Funeral Chapel. Mr. Ozanne died Monday, May 6 in Portland.

He was born February 5, 1893 in San Francisco, Calif., the son of William and Amalia Ozanne. He served in the United States

Navy aboard the U.S.S. Colorado from 1909 until his honorable discharge in 1913.
