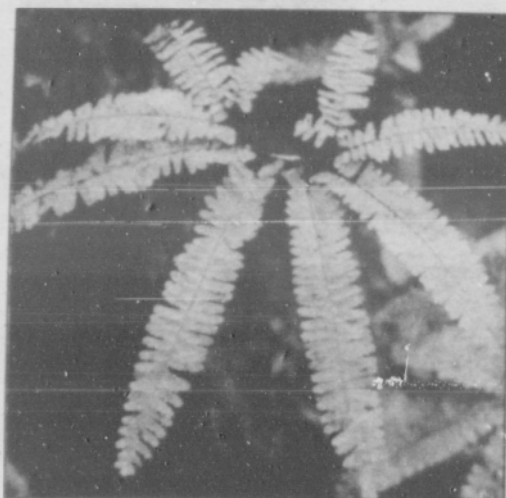


COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE



Lush green forest and beautiful falls. . .

Back on the road, drive through the quiet of damp, lush forests to Bridal Veil Falls and then Multnomah Falls, the second highest waterfall in the United States. Zigzag your way up the trail to the top and watch Multnomah Falls plunge into a pool 620 feet below.

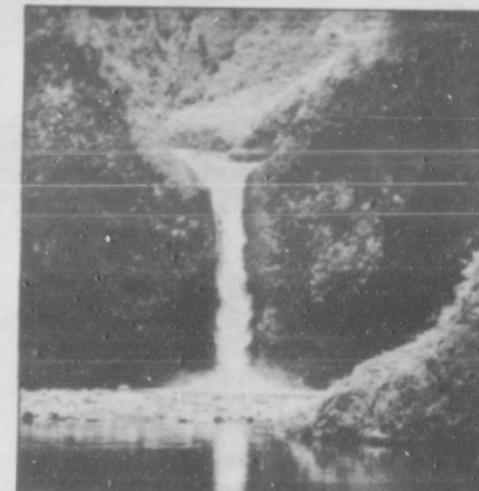
Hop back on the freeway and drive out to Bonneville Dam, a major source

of hydroelectric power for the northwest. Watch salmon climb the fish ladder, their detour around the dam. This may be the closest you'll ever get to a 25 pound salmon. But don't leave until you've found the sturgeon pool. Gaze into the pool where giant sturgeon swim. These fish, whose ancestors lived with the dinosaurs, may be larger than you.

And they are ugly!

Cascade Locks Marine Parks, home of Northwest's first steam engine, makes a great lunch stop. Here, too, you can board the Columbia Sternwheeler, a replica of the riverboats that churned up the

Mississippi in the days of Tom Sawyer and Huck Finn.

If your lucky enough to be able to spend a few days, Lost Lake resort is a great escape from city life. Take a slow paced break where Mt. Hood is reflected in the lake. Or enjoy the great fishing, boating and hiking.

Traveling across the river and east on Highway 14 the high desert turns dry and browned. Maryhill Museum of Art creates a sharp contrast with its lush green lawns and gardens. Overlooking the Gorge, the museum is often remembered for the peacocks that roam the grounds and warnings about rattlesnakes. Inside the "Castle on the Columbia"

treasures abound. Two miles down the road, huge stones cast eerie shadows across the desert at the replica of England's Stonehenge.

The Gorge offers sports and relaxation for the whole family. In fact, you can spend a day or an entire vacation in the Gorge and not run out of things to do. It may be the best answer to "There's nothing to do."

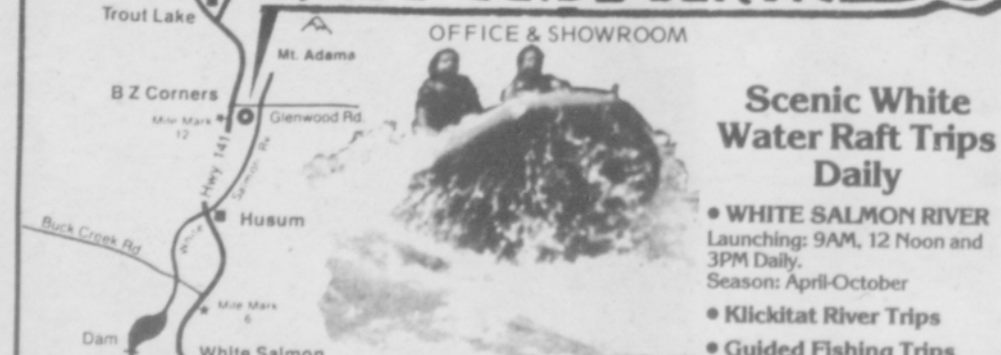

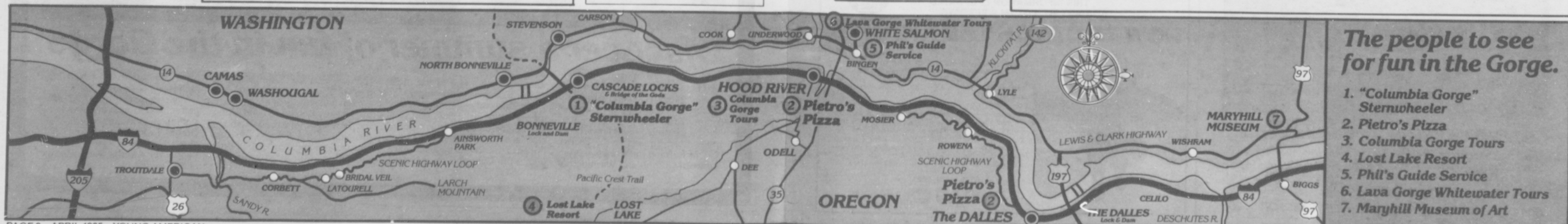
