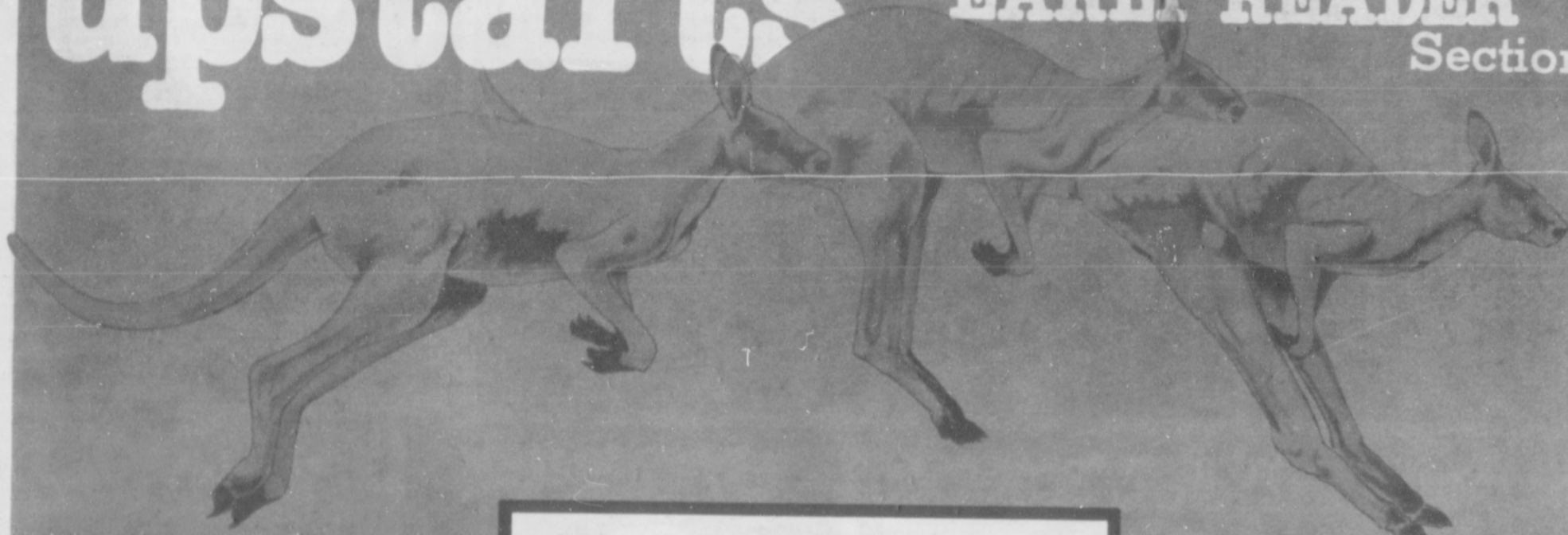

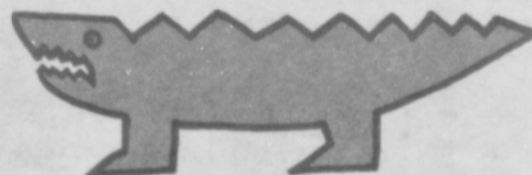


They spring across the ground in giant leaps. They can jump over a man or across a two lane street in a single bound.

1. Fold 8½ x 11 inch construction paper in half the long way.

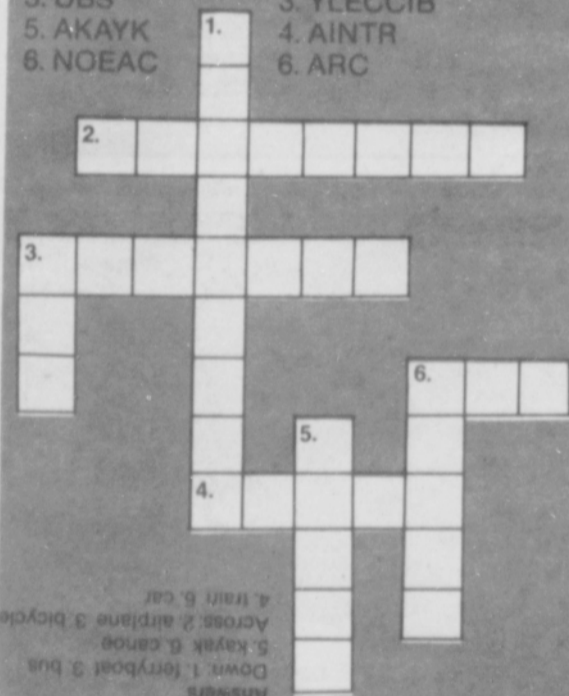
2. Draw an outline to follow when you cut out the gator.

SUMMER SAFETY TIPS



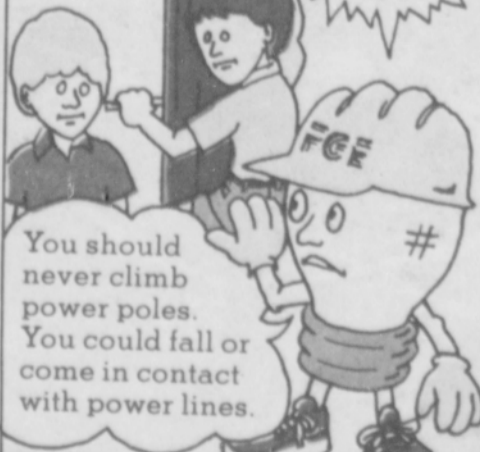
Bet you can't climb this pole.
