The All-Americans must earn a 3.3 or better grade point average. Only scholars selected by a secondary school instructor, counselor or other qualified sponsor are accepted. These scholars are also eligible for other awards given by the NSEC.

"Recognizing and supporting our youth is more important than ever before in American history," said George Stevens, executive director of the National Secondary Education Council. "Certainly, winners of the Academic All-American Awards should be congratulated and appreciated for their dedication to excellence and achievement."
