Wrestler-dunk to benefit Setterlund

Imagine a Portland professional wrestler at your mercy.

Imagine him sitting precariously on a platform above a tank filled with water. You throw a ball, it hits the target and you've dunked one of the stars of Portland professional wrestling.

That opportunity will exist on Sun-

day, July 28 at Rainbow Trout Farms seven miles east of Sandy. They place where you can still catch a fish for a buck.

The occasion is a benefit, a benefit to raise funds to save the life of a 13-year-old child, Heidi Setterlund. It will be a day of trout fishing, music, hot dogs, games and prizes. The

benefit is being sponsored by Mike and Marti Kaiser, owners of the Rainbow Trout Farms, and KRDR Radio. A family kind of day and one's attendance will help change the course of Setterlund's life.

Setterlund lives in East County with her mother, Judy, and younger brother, Steve. Four months ago she was diagnosed as suffering from a rare form of adult leukemia (Wyleoblastic leukemia). The prognosis from her doctors at Oregon Health Sciences University is that Setterlund's best hope of survival lies in an expensive, complicated treatment — a bone marrow transplant from her brother Steve.

Setterlund is extremely fortunate in that her only brother is a near perfect match for this procedure. However, the procedure that will give Setterlund life has a price tag of \$100,000.

Judy Setterlund is attempting to raise the funds for this procedure as

she hasn't any medical insurance that will cover it. Thanks to hard work and the generous spirits of volunteers, the fund has grown to over \$25,000. Rainbow Farm's Benefit Day for Setterlund has the potential to increase that amount. "All you have to do is come prepared to have a good time," Mike Kaiser said.

Admission price is \$1.50 per car. Admission and all money collected, other than for fish caught, will be donated to Setterlund's fund.

In addition to food, music and the dunk tank, tagged fish will be good for a prize from KRDR's sponsor barrel.

T-shirts will be available from Rainbow Farms with proceeds donated to Setterlund's fund.

Health screening van to provide stress test

How Sandy people are coping with stress will be measured during the Sandy Mountain Days, July 13 and 14, as a public service of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

A mobile health screening van operated by the Adventist Church will be located at the site of the former Thriftway parking lot from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. to provide free stress profile testing to determine the general well-being of an individual.

A blood pressure check and answers to an 18-point test will be fed into a computer. Then a printout of six areas indicating the individual's level of adjustment will be given.

High scores will indicate positive assessments. Low scores show severe or dangerous risk levels.

"The test specifically determines the load of stress each person carries in relationship to the average population," said Elaine Wallace, a nurse on the mobile health unit. "The free stress profile is based on averages from a study of 6,900 people by the National Center for Health Statistics."

"Those with below average scores will be advised to seek professional guidance or encouraged to participate in the next stress control clinic to be sponsored by the church," Wallace said.

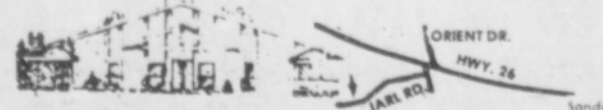
