Sandy man dies in accident

One man died Friday in a three-vehicle accident on Highway 211 near 362nd Avenue, according to Russ Williams, public information officer for the Clackamas County sheriff's department.

Pedro Montiel, about 25, of 34500 S.E. Highway 211, died in surgery at Portland Adventist Medical Center. He had been flown to the medical center by Life Flight.

Montiel was driving a 1974 Chevrolet Vega. Two passengers

with him, Oscar Cabuto, 19, and Thomas Carrasco, 26, of the same address as Montiel, were treated for minor injuries at the Mount Hood Medical Center and released, Williams said.

Stephen John Koenig, 20, Eagle Creek, the driver of a 1977 Pontiac Lemans, was released from Portland Adventist Monday, according to a hospital spokesman. He was treated for "blunt chest trauma" and lacerations, she said.

The driver of a Peterbilt truck, Marley Edward Elling, 47, Silverton, was not injured.

Koenig was passing in a no-passing zone, according to Williams. He was west bound, went into the ditch and back onto the road, hitting the Vega, which was east bound, and then the truck, which was following behind the Vega, according to the preliminary accident report. Williams said the investigation is continuing.

Ralph Richardson

Retired automobile dealer Ralph E. Richardson died at his residence in Sandy on July 10 at the age of 77.

Mr. Richardson was born on Jan. 21, 1908 in Cheyenne, Wyo. He was raised in California where, after completing high school, he attended the University of California at Berkeley for two years.

He then moved to Nebraska where he operated a service station and met Margaret Berkland, whom he married on Sept. 27, 1932 in Rapid City, S.D. They lived in South Dakota for nine years, where their son was born. Mr. Richardson was sales manager for a dairy business.

In 1941, the Richardsons came to Oregon, working in the shipyards in Portland during World War II. They lived in California for a short time but returned to Portland where Mr. Richardson got in business selling automobiles.

He purchased the Chevrolet dealership in Sandy in 1953, working until his retirement in 1968.

Mr. Richardson was instrumental in helping to start vocational training and drivers education at Sandy High School. He was a 30-year member and past president of the Kiwanis Club of Sandy, a charter and life member of the Gresham Elks and twice served as master of the Sandy Masonic Lodge.

He is survived by his wife, Margaret Richardson of Sandy; his son, Bill Richardson of Tucson, Ariz.; and two grandchildren.

Memorial services were held July 15. Private cremation was held.

The family suggests memorial contributions to the charity of one's choice.

Raymond Wilcox

Raymond L. Wilcox of Welches died July 7 at a Portland area hospital. He was 69.

Mr. Wilcox was born Jan. 11, 1916 in Springfield, Ore., the son of Guy and Susie Wilcox. He lived in the Springfield, Sandy and Welches areas of Oregon for his entire life.

He was a World War II veteran, serving as a gunner's mate on the cruiser Bosie. He was decorated with 10 bronze and two silver stars for his service.
