Chicken salad recipe offered

Here are some recipes you may want to try this summer.

Chinese Chicken Salad

Cook three breasts of chicken in water with a slice of fresh ginger (a few sprinkles of dry ginger may be substituted) until done. Drain, cool and cut up. Crab meat may be substituted.

1 head of lettuce, broken into bite size.

1/2 package rice sticks, deep fried in 1 1/2 inches hot oil, just until they explode. Remove immediately and drain on paper towel. Sticks may be broken into shorter lengths before frying.

3 to 6 green onions sliced diagonally.

1 small package of toasted, slivered almonds.

Use 350 degree oven.

Spread almonds and sesame seeds on baking pan and check for doneness.

1/4 cup sesame seeds, toasted.

Note: Rice sticks may be found in oriental food section at Fred Meyer's. They resemble spaghetti.

Dressing

Ingredients: 4 Tablespoons sugar; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon Accent; 1/2 teaspoon pepper; 4 Tablespoons vinegar; 1/2 cup oil.

Combine first five ingredients and dissolve over low heat. Cool and add oil. Toss on salad just before serving. Serves six. From the files of Gretchen Chilton, Sandy.

Broccoli Casserole

Ingredients: 10 oz. chopped broccoli; 1 can mushroom soup, undiluted; 1 small onion, chopped; 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese; 1/2 cup

mayonnaise; 15 crushed Ritz crackers.

Mix first five ingredients, saving 1/4 to 1/2 cup of the cheese for putting on top just before sprinkling on crushed Ritz crackers. Delicious! Serves six. From the files of Karen Krum, Sandy.

Here's a delightful recipe for the berry season.

Stuffed Angel Food Cake

Pick out the center of day-old angel food cake leaving shell 1 1/2 inches thick on sides and bottom. Slice one quart of large strawberries, saving enough — about 1 dozen — for decoration. Sugar berries to taste and let stand. (I use fruit cocktail, well drained, instead of berries.)

Mix 1 (3 ounce) package orange gelatin with 1 cup water and three-fourths cup orange juice, in which is juice of 1/2 lemon. If you use fruit cocktail, just drain juice, measure it, and use for part of water in making Jell-O.

When gelatin is half set, pour in juice, which has collected on berries, and beat it until light. Fold in cake crumbs. Pour in 1 1/2 inch layer of gelatin mixture in bottom of shell, then layer of strawberries, and continue until cake is filled, putting crumb mix on top.

Put in refrigerator to set for at least two hours to insure firmness.

One-half hour before serving, whip 1 1/2 cups whipping cream, add 4 Tablespoons powdered sugar and 1/2 teaspoon vanilla. Ice cake with whipped cream and decorate with whole berries.

Clackamas County residents who want to compete in the 1985 county fair talent contest will need to audition Monday.

Acts will be viewed from 4 to 7 p.m. that day at the main pavilion on the fairgrounds in Canby.

The talent show starts at 7 p.m. Aug. 13, the opening day of the fair. It will feature performers in two categories: those under 14 years of age and those older than 14.

Cash awards of \$50, \$25 and \$15 will go to the three best acts in the junior division. Older performers compete for prizes of \$100, \$50 and \$25. An "audience trophy" will be given to the act selected by a popular vote of the audience.

seeking, help in fighting the crime problem.

Of five recent programs on neighborhood watches, only two drew a substantial number of people. The meetings drew groups of five, 25, 20, 10 and nine people.

Vicars said they have "real talented people, real pros" in the crime prevention area, and they are always available to put on programs.

They also have a program whereby officers "harden the target" — inspecting one's home and offering advice on how to keep criminals from breaking in.

The Boring Neighborhood Watch program was cited as one that has been extremely effective. In addition,

Brooks said they are working on utility watch (with people in utility trucks keeping an eye out) and realtor watch programs.

They have rebuilt the sheriff's reserve from 47 to over 100, and have a goal of training 130 reserve officers. There are currently "training patrols" in the ZigZag area, Brooks said.

People need to get to know their neighbors so they can recognize strangers. We are promoting a "non-aphathy posture toward your community," he said.

Vicars added people should call about anything suspicious. Officers do not mind responding to what could possibly turn out to be a false alarm.
