

Skipper heads trio at US track meet

SEATTLE — Art Skipper of the Sandy River Hawks Track Club took third place at the National Junior Olympic Track Meet in Seattle Friday, July 26, by throwing the javelin 176-6.

In the boys' intermediate 800-meter run, Brad Schmautz took seventh place, but did not run in the finals as meet officials took only six runners.

"Why they did not fill all eight lanes is a mystery to me," said Coach Darold Beymer, "but Schmautz was left out when they decided to take only six."

Kim Jones was 15th in the young women's 3,000. Jones did not run up to her capability in this meet, according to Beymer, saying she felt very tired.

"I am proud," said Beymer, "that these young people from Sandy made the national championship meet."

"They are the greatest."

EUGENE — The Clackamas County Bank 13- to 15-year-old girls softball team, after sweeping their way to the state title earlier, came back to earth at the Northwest regional tournament July 19-21.

The Sandy team earned a tie for seventh in the 16-squad field by splitting their four games.

They lost to Wenatchee in their first game 6-1, then beat a Seattle-area team 9-5, came from behind to out-muscle the Milwaukee Stingers 7-5 and were eliminated by the Eugene Little Devils 3-1.

Wenatchee 6, CCB 1

Wenatchee tripled twice in the second inning, helping themselves to four runs to put the game out of reach early. They also scored unearned runs in the fourth and sixth.

Sandy's lone run came in the sixth, when Kelli Portinga doubled to right. Jerri Willis sacrificed her to third and Portinga stole home.

CCB 9, Seattle 5

CCB got off the mark fast and were never threatened as they eased to their first win of the tournament.

In the first inning, Willis and Julie Powell hit consecutive singles, Jamie Brittle followed with a walk, then Portinga knocked in two runs with a double. Brittle stole home as CCB scored three in the first.

They also scored three in the third when Brittle walked, Tami Tinjum doubled to left, Portinga reached on an error and Tiffany Griffin singled.

Brittle hit a homer in the fourth with Willis on board for two more, then Connie Jones scored after a Traci Ayers single for one in the fifth to make the score 9-0.
