Strike three! You're out! Deep in the heart of the baseball season it may come as a surprise that there is another type of "strike" that can put you out, too.

In colonial America, if you wanted to become a skilled worker such as a carpenter, baker, tailor or tinsmith, you had to find a person who had their own shop and who was willing to teach you all the skills you needed. These people were called "master craftsmen."

After you found a master craftsman, you had to agree to work for them as an "apprentice" for little or no money for several years. After you served out your apprenticeship time, you became a "journeyman."

Journeyman worked for master craftsmen and were paid well for their labor. While a journeyman, a man might save up his pay and open his own shop as a master craftsman.

In the late 1700s machines started to be used to make things that people had made by hand before. Craftsmen were forced to compete with factories which produced the same sort of goods they made by hand. The craftsmen found

first strike in the U.S. Journeymen printers in New York City quit working until their pay was increased to \$1.00 per day. This strike created problems for master craftsmen who needed to print newspapers, books and handbills, so the journeymen eventually won.

Recently another group of skilled workers went on strike throughout the U.S. This strike may have "put you out" by causing you to spend extra time in an airport or even cancel a vacation. Do you know what skilled job these workers do?
